Dear Parishioners,

This is the first week of Lent. This season is often marked with the title Lenten Exercises. Just as our bodies benefit from rigorous and sustained physical effort, our souls also need to be stretched and pushed in order for it to be strengthened. Aside from the normal fasting and abstinence, prayer and alms giving, we have also lined up a few more Lenten activities to facilitate this. First, everyone is invited for the communal recitation of the Stations of the Cross every Friday after the 12:15 Mass. There is no communal evening stations of the cross but we encourage individuals or groups to still use the Church for it anytime and any day during Lent. We will also have speakers coming during this time to expound more on their thoughts of Lent. I have also invited a mission speaker to come during the Holy Week. ABOUT THE VOTIVE CANDLES

For a long time now, many have been requesting to have the votive candle stands by the Blessed Mother and by St Joseph fixed or replaced. We have been made aware that many candles do not work. And we understand how it could be so frustrating to have nothing to accompany the prayer intentions we offer to the Blessed Mother or to Saint Joseph. We have looked high and low at options and possibilities. After inquiring with a few companies, we were advised that two stands can still be fixed, but the rest are quite difficult and more expensive to have repaired.

After much deliberation, we have thus decided to have two fixed and purchase two more new stands. It's not an easy decision because the price of each stand is expensive, ranging from about \$4,000 to even more depending on size and customized features. So far, one parishioner has generously donated \$1,000 towards it. We will try to find the money so that we can purchase them right away but we would like to offer them to generous parishioners who would like family or friends remembered as we memorialize them by inscribing their names in recognition plaques. 



Lenten Regulations for Fasting & Abstaining

All Catholics who have reached their 14th year are bound to <u>abstain entirely from meat/poultry</u> on Ash Wednesday and <u>ALL the Fridays of Lent.</u> All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are also bound to <u>observe the law of fast</u> on <u>Ash Wednesday</u> and <u>Good Friday</u>. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.


