FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

On the CORONA VIRUS issue: To formally outline the measures we are implementing with the guidance from the directives of the diocese, please be guided accordingly.

- 1. We have suspended the distribution of the Precious Blood since December to the congregation except for the clergy or those who for health reason must only receive the Precious Blood.
- 2. The diocesan directive cancels the Sign of Peace, but we are keeping it with a reminder before the exchange to refrain from hugging, kissing or shaking hands. A simple bow would suffice.
- 3. Parishioners are instructed to remain at home if they are sick. This includes priests, deacons, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, lectors, altar servers, ushers, music ministers, etc.. Those who are able to attend Mass should be encouraged to wash and sanitize their hands.
- 4. Priests, deacons, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion and altar servers should wash their hands before serving. Disinfectant soap and/or hand sanitizer are provided for them. Clergy and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are encouraged to wash / disinfect their hands after serving as well.
- 5. Holy water fonts at the doors of the church continue to be emptied and cleaned several times per week, especially before and after weekends. ...*continued on page 4*

- 6. Parishioners who prefer to receive Holy Communion on the tongue still have that right, though they may freely choose to receive the Sacred Host in their hands during this precautionary time. (See *Redemptionis Sacramentum*, no. 92)
- 7. Cleaning and disinfecting practices normally carried out in our churches and parish facilities are given extra and careful attention during this time.
- 8. The clergy have been instructed to discontinue the practice of shaking hands when greeting parishioners after Mass.

We continue to monitor developments in our community and will make an effort to make informed responses immediately and accordingly.

This week we celebrate St. Patrick's Day and St. Joseph's Day. More than the feasting that we associate with them, we are reminded to pray and ask for their intercession for the Church and the world that we might be able to hurdle with hope and courage in this very confusing time.

April 6, 7 and 8, 2020 at 7:00 pm Speaker: **Fr Rene Lopez, PSS**



Fr. Renato José E. Lopez, PSS is a member of the Society of Saint Sulpice, a group of diocesan priests who dedicate themselves to the formation of priests and seminarians. He taught the New Testament at St. Mary's Seminary and University in Baltimore, MD from 2007-2017. He is current Vice-Rector for Formation At Assumption Seminary in San Antonio, TX.

Fr. Lopez studied at the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome and the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, obtaining the Licentiate in Sacred Theology in 1994. He considers preaching retreats and guiding pilgrims in the Holy Land a special mission. They provide him with a unique pastoral opportunity to share his love for the Word of God.

The retreat is an invitation to reflect prayerfully on three core themes of Christian Spirituality: 1. **The God of all Creation**: the entire created universe is a sacrament. We encounter God in what he has made. 2. **The God of Covenantal Love**: We believe in the God Jesus believed in. 3. **Jesus, the Word of God Incarnate**: Jesus is the fullness of God's self-expression.

Lenten Regulations for Fasting & Abstaining

All Catholics who have reached their 14th year are bound to <u>abstain entirely from meat/</u> <u>poultry</u> on Ash Wednesday and <u>ALL the</u> <u>Fridays of Lent.</u> All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are also bound to <u>observe the law of fast</u> on <u>Ash Wednesday</u> and <u>Good Friday</u>. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.
