### FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

I am writing this Easter message on Holy Monday. I started at 8:30 this morning, left it, returned to it, left it again, returned to it again, over and over again...and still nothing. It is now 5:10 pm and I still have no clear direction where my thought and reflection should go. I have been trying to convince myself: this should be easy. Easter brings so many good and positive things that should be easy to write about. But we all know that this Easter is not the same as the other Easters in the past. So, how relevant is the message of Easter to us all today?

Right now, there is so much uncertainty, confusion, doubt, darkness, gloom, unhappiness, anxiety, stress - so much dis-ease brought by this disease. Overwhelming does not even begin to describe what we are all going through. And how we wish this was already over. How we all wish we were back to normal. We all ask: How can we have a meaningful celebration of Holy Week amidst all these? Are we even going to have a true Easter celebration this year?

Then I realize, the only way to find meaning in Easter is to be reminded how essentially connected it is with Good Friday. It struck me that Easter Sunday cannot happen without Good Friday. And so, could it be that what we are all being asked to do this time, difficult as it may be, is to allow ourselves to go through everything, not to rush to Easter, not rush to the normal, but fully go through what we are feeling and experiencing. For it is in all these that we can get a glimpse of what Jesus went through - his passion, his suffering, his death. Starting with the agony in the garden, to his arrest, to his trial, to the path he took to his crucifixion and finally his death on the cross. He surely felt uncertain, confused, doubtful; he saw darkness, gloom

# Happy Easter!

All of you have been on my heart, especially this week. I have been meditating and praying a lot on one scripture verse in particular; "Watch and pray", from the Gospel of Matthew, which was read on Palm Sunday. This verse is one that I have always loved, but it hit me especially hard this week. Jesus tells His Apostles to keep watch as He prays in the Garden of Gethsemane; His last moments before He is arrested and brought to slaughter. These moments for Jesus were not peaceful; He prayed in agony, alone and in pain, asking God if He really had to die. This week, on Palm Sunday, hearing "Watch and pray" in this current climate spoke so deeply to my heart; Right now, we don't have each other to celebrate with, and we feel alone without our Parish community. and unhappiness; he went through tremendous stress and anxiety. He felt overwhelmed. More than ever, because of what we are going through right now, we get to experience in a very real way Jesus' passion, his suffering, and to some extent his death. And it's not going to be easy because this time we are not only spectators but participants. But a promise is given to those who participate, that if we believe from the heart, if we go through his passion and his death then we can with certainty also experience new life in his resurrection. And so be patient and hopeful, pray that you can truly feel what Jesus felt. For it is only when we go through his Good Friday that we can also share in his Easter.

Maybe our Easter this year will not be as festive, as party-filled as we are all used to. Maybe we might not have the same external semblances of what we think Easter should have. But maybe this time we can begin to realize that Easter is not only what we see outside. It is essentially one that is reached by an internal journey of the soul – from Jesus' passion and death on Good Friday to a new glorious life in Easter in his Resurrection.
