2nd Reading: 1 Peter 2:4-9 Those who have faith are chosen in Christ to be a holy priesthood.

Gospel Reading: John 14:1–12 Jesus tells his disciples, "I am the way and the truth and the life."

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear parishioners,

When I was a young boy, I remember that whenever I would be awakened at night by either the scary sound of thunder, a nightmare or a toothache, I would run crying to my parents room. No matter what, no matter how tired they were, both my parents would always wake up and with gentleness attend to me. My mother would tell my father to go back to sleep and she would carry me, ask what is the matter as she tries to calm me down. But the challenge for her is convincing me to go back to my room and get back to my bed to sleep. I would always refuse to go back. She would still bring me. But no words would make me settle and feel safe. I would only agree to lay back in bed and try to close my eyes and attempt to go back to sleep if she would allow me to hold her hand. I remember my mother's hands. They were not soft but instead calloused in certain parts from working at home doing the household chores and also from her work as a teacher in the local public school where she taught. But those hands were great comfort for me, to know that when I held on to her hand, she was in fact holding me; and that I did not need to be afraid, that it was going to be ok.

The message for this Sunday's Gospel reading is clear: Do not let your hearts be troubled, have faith in God. This passage is part of what scholars call Jesus' farewell discourse, placed sometime after the last supper as He foreshadowed his impending death and his departure from his disciples. Jesus was assuring his friends that even if he was leaving them, that he will prepare a place for them, and that he wanted them to follow him. And so do not be afraid.

Sacraments Updates: ALL ARE POSTPONED

As all of you by now have seen, and as stated above, the new social distance end date, as announced by the State, is Friday, May 15th. This is right in the middle of our Sacrament Season. After advice from the Diocese and in accordance with this new social distance ruling, <u>the decision has been made to postpone all First Holy Communions, to a new date to be announced</u>. Once we are able to monitor the curve and receive both State and Diocesan updates, we will then be able to reschedule the First Holy Communions, and First Reconciliations, for those who did not yet receive. The light at the end of the tunnel here is that <u>First Holy Communions are not cancelled; They are postponed</u>. I will have new dates for everyone as soon as we get clearance for social distancing, which I hope and pray is as soon as humanly possible.



In regard to Confirmation, <u>Confirmation, originally scheduled for Friday, May 29th, will be postponed</u>, to a new date to be announced. We have not received updates from the Diocese regarding when this new, rescheduled date will be, since they are waiting on social distancing updates from the State. We will be updating everyone with all information as soon as we receive it. Like First Holy Communion, Confirmation is not cancelled; It is postponed.

With social distance regulations and safety procedures constantly changing, this causes our Office, and every Faith Formation Office in the Diocese, to cancel and push back plans as soon as we make them, only to start over again and have those plans scrapped, too. Although a lot is uncertain for all of us right now, what I can guarantee as a sure thing to everyone is our dedication to your children and your families, and that our first priority is to keep everyone who would normally be in attendance for these special and sacred days safe and healthy. Please continue to pray for our world as we navigate all of this together.
