FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

It is a widely known Catholic tradition of honoring Mary during the month of May and has been especially recommended by the Popes. Pius XII made frequent reference to it and in his great Encyclical on the Sacred Liturgy (Mediator Dei) characterized it as one of "other exercises of piety which although not strictly belonging to the Sacred Liturgy, are nevertheless of special import and dignity, and may be considered in a certain way to be an addition to the liturgical cult: they have been approved and praised over and over again by the Apostolic See and by the Bishops".

Paul VI wrote a short encyclical in 1965 using the Month of Mary devotion as a means of obtaining prayers for peace. He urged the faithful to make use of this practice which is "gladdening and consoling" and by which the Blessed Virgin Mary is honored and the Christian people are enriched with spiritual gifts".

In May of 2002 Pope John Paul II said, "Today we begin the month dedicated to Our Lady a favorite of popular devotion. In accord with a long-standing tradition of devotion, parishes and families continue to make the month of May a 'Marian' month, celebrating it with many devout liturgical, catechetical and pastoral initiatives!"

Students, parents, families, and parishioners: As all of right now, all meetings and activities across our Diocese here on Long Island have been <u>CANCELLED</u>. Masses continued to be offered virtually not only through our own Parish livestreams on our Facebook, Instagram, and YouTube Channel, but also through our friends at Catholic Faith Network on television.

This week, we received a letter from Bishop Barres regarding what the status is regarding the reinstitution of Mass. I ask all of you to consider this; The same way that every Parish on Long Island is waiting on updates from the Diocese, the Diocese is waiting on updates from the State, who are waiting on the advice of healthcare professionals who are working tirelessly to keep us safe. Because of this, right now, <u>there is no date as to when Mass will be reinstated</u>. Reinstituting Mass, where hundreds of people gather in an enclosed space every week, at this point in time, would put the people of our Parish in danger, as thousands of previously healthy people have been loosing their lives every day. Our Parish's and Program's health and well-being is always the first priority.

We miss all of you very much, but we still have some activities planed for you that you can take part in and enjoy from home with your families! We hope that all of you are well and staying safe, and that we will be able to celebrate the Eucharist together in person soon!
