Sacraments Updates

As all of you by now have seen, and as stated above, the new social distance end date, as announced by the State, is Friday, May 15th. This is right in the middle of our Sacrament Season. After advice from the Diocese and in accordance with this new social distance ruling, <u>the decision has been made to postpone all First Holy</u> <u>Communions, to a new date to be announced</u>. Once we are able to monitor the curve and receive both State and Diocesan updates, we will then be able to reschedule the First Holy Communions, and First Reconciliations, for those who did not yet receive. The light at the end of the tunnel here is that <u>First Holy Communions are not</u> <u>cancelled; They are postponed</u>. I will have new dates for everyone as soon as we get clearance for social distancing, which I hope and pray is as soon as humanly possible.



In regard to Confirmation, Confirmation for us is scheduled to take place on Friday, May 29th. Since this day falls exactly two weeks after the proposed social distance ending date, as of right now, in this point in time, Confirmation Day is still on as scheduled. <u>This may change, in light of the current situation</u>. We will be updating everyone with all information as soon as we receive it.

With social distance regulations and safety procedures constantly changing, this causes our Office, and every Faith Formation Office in the Diocese, to cancel and push back plans as soon as we make them, only to start over again and have those plans scrapped, too. Although a lot is uncertain for all of us right now, what I can guarantee as a sure thing to everyone is our dedication to your children and your families, and that our first priority is to keep everyone who would normally be in attendance for these special and sacred days safe and healthy. Please continue to pray for our world as we navigate all of this together.

Here in the parish we encourage everyone to pray at noon. We are working on a video recitation of both prayers as I lead it while families from our parish join in the responses. They will be broadcast on You tube and Facebook as a guide for prayer.

On Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, please feel free to join the Zoom recitation of the Holy Rosary at 6:00 pm. Details on how to join on page 2. I would like to thank the Holy Rosary Society for hosting this. We started a few weeks ago with about 6 people, and now we are up to an average of 11 participants. Here is the screenshot of those who regularly attend the rosary. Please help us promote this worthwhile devotion.

If the time and day does not work for you, I encourage anyone especially the younger families to start hosting your own Holy Rosary "parties". Invite your friends; and tell your friends to invite their other friends. Aside from Zoom, there are other good platforms you can use like Google meets and Skype. The key is to make it regular and non-negotiable. Send me an email and I will

OFFERING MASSES

Because of the suspension of gatherings during Wakes and Funeral Masses and also a very limited way in which we can show our sympathies and condolences to bereaved families, we would like to inform everyone that you may as usual offer Masses for deceased family and friends to show solidarity with them. The following is a step by step procedure for you to be able do this from your home.

To request for Masses:

Call the office (631-6674044) during office hours (new office hours: Monday, Wednesday, Friday from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm) and speak with the receptionist to check the availability of the day and time when you want your Mass(es) to be said. When available, your intention will be reserved for the date and time of your choice.

You may then proceed to either mail or drop off your check at the Parish Center indicating the Mass intention, and the date and time requested.

Or for your convenience, you may also pay online by visiting our website: sscmdp.org and clicking the green "Donate" button on the top right hand corner. Go to the bottom of the page and under Mass Intention, enter the amount and on the space provided the reserved date, time and the name for the whom the Mass is being offered.

For Mass Cards:

Call the office during office hours and speak to the receptionist. She will mail the card to the intended addressee once the payment is received. Payment options are the same as stated in "To request for Masses".
