FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

We received instruction from the diocese that as the NY State entered Phase 2 of its reopening plan, which began Wednesday, June 10, we may now host public liturgies and Sacraments (Mass, weddings, funerals, baptisms, etc.) in churches/indoor facilities with **25% building capacity in attendance.**

We have a seating map that allows us **244 people maximum** for every liturgical celebration. The seating arrangement follows guidelines to allow CDC prescribed distance of 6 feet from others. You may check the website for a graphic layout of the seating arrangement. The seating plan allows for couples/pairs and families who come from the same household to sit together. But the new seating arrangement will mean people will not be able to sit in their usual "favorite" pew. We will have to be patient and more understanding of our limitations at this time. The ushers will be assisting those attending Sunday Mass with the new seating plan.

Masks must be worn by all present with the exception of children under two years of age or by anyone with breathing difficulties. Homemade mask or scarf is admissible as long as it covers the nose and mouth. With or without masks, the 6 feet distance must be strictly observed.

With all these in mind, we will begin the usual schedule of **daily Masses** (7:00am, 8:30am and 12:15 am) in the Church starting **Monday**, **June 15**. We will continue to livestream the 8:30 am daily Mass for the sake of those who are still unable to come to Church.

Starting on Father's Day weekend (**June 20-21**), we will resume the usual **Sunday schedule of Masses** (Saturday 5:00 pm Vigil Mass, and Sunday 8:00am, 9:30am, 11:00am, 12:30pm and

6:00pm). We will be livestreaming only the 9:30am Mass for those at home. We would like to apologize if the presence of cameras on tripods and computer equipment may slightly distract you, but please know that it is a temporary set-up for us to be able to livestream properly. We are working on investing on equipment and having them installed and set-up so that they would not block the view. We hope to eventually continue being able livestream the Mass to minister to the sick and the homebound parishioners beyond the pandemic.

Starting Monday, June 15, the Church will be open for private prayers from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm. Once again, please sit only in designated pews. And please do not remove barriers. As expected, always wear your mask in the Church and maintain the 6 feet distancing requirement and refrain from congregating. Because it is restricted space, we will be temporarily locking the children's chapel.

Entrance for private prayer, and the Daily and Sunday Masses will be limited to the **breezeway entrance** and the **entrance door by the garage**. Please refrain from entering through the main doors for now. We will be using them exclusively for exits only on the weekend Masses. This is also to prevent interruptions as the confessions are now moved to the Childrens' Chapel.

Confessions will now be done after the 12:15 Mass on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The confessionals will not be used. Instead, we are moving confessions to the Childrens' Chapel. Please follow designated entrance and exit doors when coming to confession and always wear a mask.

As I have previously written to you, we have hired a new cleaning company that sprays the Church with sanitizing solution on a weekly basis. We will also continue to clean and sanitize the Church Monday to Friday when we close at 3:00pm. But we will also be sanitizing the Church in between Masses on Sundays. This will involve wiping the pews, door handles, and airing out the Church. **We would like to ask for volunteers for every Mass to help us with this task**. Thanking in advance volunteers and our ushers who will help us accomplish this.

Holy Communion in the Diocese of Rockville Centre will be distributed after the Mass has ended. This allows for those who have reservation about receiving to leave the Church after the blessing. It also gives time for the priests and ministers to do what is necessary to prepare for the extra-ordinary requirements needed to give out communion at this time.

After the final blessing, those who wish to receive fall in line maintaining 6 feet distance from each other. To receive, communicants remove their masks. As usual, they may receive by hand or mouth. The priest or minister would have to use an ablution cup and hand sanitizer for his hands every so often, thus the need for a table when he/she distributes communion.

At the conclusion of the distribution of Holy Communion, the faithful may depart after a brief personal prayer of thanksgiving.

We have all suffered greatly being deprived of public Mass for nearly 3 months. But the battle is far from over. We still need to be prudent and careful. We need your cooperation, patience and understanding. With God's grace, with the help of our Mother Mary, with much prayer and together, for sure, we will get through this.

THE MINISTRY OF CONSOLATION

The Ministry of Consolation is a ministry that reaches out to and assists families at a very critical and sensitive time when they are mourning the death of a loved one.

The Ministry of Consolation offers a wide variety of ways for parishioners to be involved. The different ministries involved in the Ministry of Consolation are:

Consolation Minister, Sacristan, Computer People, Greeters, Cake Bakers, and Readers.

Consolation Minister assists the family with planning the funeral liturgy that includes choosing scripture readings and hymns and suggests ways in which the family can be a part of the liturgy.

Sacristan assists the priest by performing various tasks at and around the altar during Mass. **Greeters** act as ushers at the Mass, handing out booklets and directing the family and visitors to their seats. Greeters also may act as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion at the Mass.

Computer People make the booklets, which serve as worship aids at the Mass; the booklets contain the information that the Consolation Minister has gathered from the family. **Cake Baker** will bake a cake, along with a condolence card from the parish, to the family, as an expression of care and concern. The baked good is presented to the family at the end of the Funeral Mass.

Reader will proclaim the readings and the Universal Prayer, if there are to be no readers from the family.
