I will be dedicating the walled section behind the Parish Center for this purpose. We are currently still waiting for updates from the State regarding a plan for the re-opening of schools for the fall. Because of this, <u>we will be waiting to start Registration</u> until there is a clearer picture of the status of in-person learning for students. <u>As soon as we receive protocol</u> from the State regarding what can and cannot be done with school, we will be able to give all of you a definite plan with how Registration for the Fall will go, and when it will be taking place. I am kindly asking for all of you to bear with us; This is new territory for everyone, and we are taking everything as it comes. Whenever Registration will be, we so look forward to welcoming back our current families, as well as welcoming and meeting our new ones!

## **Status of Sacrament Season**

So much has been happening here in such a short amount of time! By now, all of you will have seen in last week's Bulletin, and for our Program's parents, the last weekly email that I sent out, that we are now permitted an allowance of one hundred more people in the Church at a given time as of Wednesday, July 8th. This allows our maximum amount to 344. With this news, it gives me great joy to tell you that we are in the middle of moving forward with Sacraments! **First Holy Communion:** 

All of our First Holy Communion students' parents received emails <u>this past Monday</u> with the dates and times of their children's Masses, as well as dates and times for their rehearsals. All of our Level 2 Catechists also called their classes to make sure that the information was received, so that we could cover all of our bases! Please be sure to keep all of these students and their families in your prayers!

#### **Confirmation:**

Confirmation logistics are currently being laid out, with how many people are permitted in the Church at a given time, and with how many Level 8 students that we have. This day takes a lot of planning, and with how exact our figures have to be with Church capacity, we will be sending this information out to all of our Confirmation families shortly!

With restrictions being what they are, planning all of these days is an incredibly huge undertaking. I am both kindly asking everyone to please bear with us as we plan to celebrate our students, and am also humbly asking all of you for your prayers.

We would like to thank everyone for following all safety precautions we have set with our return to the regular schedule of Masses inside the Church. We just would like to remind you about a few things: we ask that you please keep your masks on at all times while you are in the church. Please do not pull the mask off of your nose. The experts have advised that the mask must be worn over both your mouth and nose, in order for it to be effective. For the reception of Holy Communion, please follow the directions of the ushers. For all isles, please join the line one row at a time. When you do get in line, please remember to keep at least 6 feet of distance between the person in front of you and the person behind you. If you are receiving Holy Communion in your hand, please hold both your hands out flat, one hand on top of the other so that the priest can easily place the host in your palm, without touching you.

We have adjusted the seating restriction to every other pew. However, we will be maintaining the necessary 6 feet distance, and will still follow the requirement for wearing a mask when in Church. The Church will now be able to accommodate 344 persons. Please see page 6 to see the seating diagram.
