#### FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The Diocese has issued some enforcements and adjustments to the liturgical guidelines set on June 9, 2020. Below is a list of what we will implement here in Ss Cyril and Methodius:

- 1. It is recommended that Churches continue to function with alternating pews closed (every other pew remaining open). Our Church is big enough to accommodate a sizeable number. But if attendance exceeds capacity, we are ready to do an overflow Mass either in the gym or the basement.
- 2. The cleaning measures we have initiated will be maintained. In addition we are studying other ways of more effectively sanitizing the Church on a regular basis.
- 3. Protocols regarding masks and social distancing remain in effect.
- 4. **Holy Communion Distribution**: Some people continue to express their reluctance to receive Holy Communion at this time. The primary rationale for the current procedures for Communion distribution is to create two separate departure groups. Those not wishing to receive could easily depart while the priest removes his vestments, puts on his mask and sanitizes his hands. Those who receive Communion are the second departure group. This lessens the number of people exiting the Church at the same time and promotes easier social distancing inside and outside of the Church.

#### FROM THE PASTOR

Several pastors have noted that this system (though unusual) has worked. However, other pastors have expressed that they find it difficult to explain the reasoning to the people, or that the number of people reluctant to receive is negligible.

Since there is no current evidence that Mass attendance has caused a spreading of the virus in our Diocese, beginning this weekend, the following procedures will be adopted:

- a. Holy Communion will now be distributed at the normal time during the celebration of Mass.
- b. Priests and those distributing Holy Communion put on their masks and sanitize their hands immediately before distributing Communion. We are being reminded that we must practice the utmost reverence for the Blessed Sacrament:
  - i. The faithful are not to "walk away" with the Sacred Host.
  - ii. If they receive Holy Communion, they must consume the Host immediately.
  - iii. If the minister is masked, those receiving Holy Communion can lower their mask immediately before receiving the Sacred Host.
  - iv. The Precious Blood is still not to be distributed at this time.
  - v. The Sign of Peace is still to be omitted.
  - vi. We have been told NOT to wear gloves while either distributing or receiving Holy Communion. The Center for Disease Control advises that gloves should only be worn when one is cleaning or caring for the sick.
- 5. The use of Choirs continues to be strongly discouraged. Hymnals and "worship aids" also continue to be removed from the pews. Cantors are used, and people may respond to parts of the Mass. But vigorous communal singing should not occur. Likewise, the number of assistants in the sanctuary during Mass will be at an absolute minimum and socially distanced.
- 6. The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains in effect. Those who are not feeling well or who are at risk are strongly advised to remain at home.
