Registration 2020-2021 Status

These past two weeks have been filled with me meeting with multiple people, from our school, to our Staff, to our publishing companies to discuss what the best course of action will be for our Program. I am currently finalizing the complete plan, and am very excited for the direction that we are going in. With that being said, **Registration** for the upcoming year will be taking place very shortly, which I am SO EXCITED about. I am even more excited for the format that I am leaning toward, as it is a plan that will both keep all of our students and their families safe, while still providing them with a truly immersive, enriching experience. I will be able to share this final plan with all of you VERY SOON, so please continue to keep up with us here, so that you will be the first to know it! That way, everyone is informed at the same time, and not individually, so that we are fair to all of our Program's families, both currently active and new. What I can tell you for certain is that to give all of our families time to get settled with this new normal with all of our children going back to school and our parents returning to work, we will be having a delayed start in when we start Formation.

How to Receive Information & How to Prepare

As we get closer to the start of Registration, there are certain things that you can do to get your family ready for this upcoming year, even before Registration starts! Current, Active Families:

These families are families who had their students enrolled with us in Family Faith Formation for the 2019-2020 Academic Year. If you are one of these families, you will continue to receive my weekly emails to keep you updated with all information regarding Registration! If there is an updated email address that you would prefer us to send information and our Registration form to, please be sure to email **faithformation@sscmdp.org**.

New, First-Time Students and/or Families:

New families are families that have students who have never been enrolled in any Faith Formation Program before. When Registration opens, all of these new families will need a copy of the child's Baptismal Certificate in order to register their child.

have also purchased new equipment and are working on fortifying the internet capability of the school that would enable the teachers to more efficiently teach and handle the new demands of remote learning for those families who have opted for this type of learning for their children. As I have written in the past, cleaning and sanitizing are priorities ever since and most especially at this most challenging time. We are assuring you a regular cleaning of all our classrooms and other facilities, as we also continue to use commercial grade filters for our ventilation system. Further, we are also looking into acquiring the most current UV technology equipment to be used to sanitize the air throughout the school facility.

For the Faith Formation Program, Ms. Laucella is currently designing a viable plan, considering all the restraining factors due to the pandemic, but will still allow us to safely continue with the religious education of our children. She has considered the fact that many of our volunteer catechists are of that age that would put them in the category of the vulnerable or compromised. The number of children enrolled, which is over a thousand, must also be taken into consideration in the logistical planning for the continuation of the faith formation program. After consulting with experts from the diocese and also coordinating with the faith formation directors of the parishes in the deanery, and discussing everything with me, she is now putting down a great plan for the reopening. Because of new set-up, the opening will be delayed but nevertheless we assure everyone that we will resume the program in a way that is effective, safe and substantial, one that will assure our children will learn about their faith and help them prepare for the sacraments they will be receiving. Please watch out for the opening of registration in the bulletin.
