Dear Parishioners

What a year 2020 has been. My condolences and prayers to anyone who has lost a loved one this year.

We started our new fiscal year on September 1st. Our collections were down \$78,544.80 as of August 31st. Our year end Financial Reports will be published as soon as our books are closed. Our Mass attendance since we have opened up to 50% of capacity has topped 1000 only once for the weekend. We are averaging \$17,498.23 per weekend since September 1st. Thank you for your continued generosity. We are averaging \$5,040.86 for mail ins and \$1,687.47 for automated giving. If you have not already signed up for automated giving, please give it some thought. If you have any questions about automated giving, please give me a call on ext.110. Every penny we receive is very important to our Parish.

The School is open and operating safely. We are cleaning it hourly and daily. There are some added costs to this, but everyone's safety is paramount. We did not have our Family Festival this August or our Parish Auction in April because of the pandemic, but we did have 5 raffles and were able to raise \$27,500 from them.

We have not had Bingo since March. There is no timetable to start it up again. We are awaiting word from the Town of Babylon. We average almost \$1,900 a week from Bingo. We do have several fundraisers to help replace some of those losses. The Portal of the Saints and SSCM Reusable Shopping Bags (see details about this in the coming weeks).

We are hoping to have more children register for the school. Many people have expressed a desire to attend our school but have a difficult time affording the tuition, especially in these tough times. We would like to have an Adopt A Child or Family Program to aid a family or families so they can attend our beautiful school (details in the very near future).

The Church is cleaned and disinfected daily another added cost. We have shorter hours at the Parish Center and made cuts in numerous areas to save money. We will be moving the Parish Staff back to the rectory in the coming weeks to save more money. We hope to rent the Parish Center to receive additional revenue. We are doing everything we can to be good stewards of the money you so generously give to our dear parish.

We need your help and prayers. Know that you are all in my thoughts and prayers. Please stay well and safe.
