Weekly Greeting from Ms. Laucella

We are officially in Ordinary Time! This week, we hear the story of God calling Samuel. Samuel, as a young boy, is asleep when he hears someone calling his name. He wakes up multiple times, and goes back to sleep each time, thinking that he must be hearing things. The last time he hears this voice, his teacher, Eli, tells Samuel that if he should hear his name again, that it was God calling him, and that he should answer. Samuel hears God's Call a final time and says, "Here I am! Your servant is listening!"



Samuel's story resonates with all of us because all of us are called by God to do something, no matter who we are. Samuel was called at a young age, and then grew up to be a true hero of the Old Testament as not only someone who listened to God's Call, but as a seer, priest, judge, prophet, and military leader. It was Samuel who later anointed King David, the greatest king Israel had ever seen, and a distant relative of Jesus in his family line. May this story remind us that all of us are called to follow God's Calling in our lives, no matter who we are, and that however long it takes for us to hear His voice, God is always waiting for our response.




Weekly Theme: The Call to Discipleship


