Hallow's core mission is to let God hallow our lives (to make them holy) and to help others do the same. The world is filled with more distractions than ever before and people are struggling to deal with increasing levels of stress and anxiety in their lives. They often turn to things like secular meditation, which focuses on the physiological management of stress, because they simply don't know that

there are meditative traditions within the Church. Interestingly enough, there has not been a rise in atheism. Instead, there has been massive growth in the self-described "Spiritual But Not Religious". Despite all the challenges that the Church is facing, this is an incredibly hopeful sign (i.e., that they are still searching for the divine in their lives) and reflective of that fact that the desire to know God is written on the human heart.

Hallow's goal as a mobile app is to meet people where they are, both physically on their mobile devices and metaphysically wherever they are on their faith journey, to give them the space and language to develop a personal relationship with God through contemplative prayer. Grounding all evangelization and catechesis in a rich prayer life (including through the Sacraments) is the key to revitalizing the Church and the world.





FROM THE PASTOR

The APP contains:

- 1. <u>Daily prayers</u> that includes Lectio Divina on the daily Gospel, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, spiritual writing, family prayers (morning, dinner, evening) the Examen, Christian Meditation, Unguided sessions, and a prayer for Spiritual Communion.
- 2. <u>Praylists</u> has between 7-20 individual meditations using a variety of contemplative prayer techniques. Themes include Humility, Calm, Gratitude, Love, Joy, Making Decisions, Forgiveness, Patience, Hope, Letting Go. A special 19-session "stuck at home" praylist released for the global health pandemic is part of Hallow Lite. It also offers entire Litanies and an entire Music praylist.
- 3. Sleep: offers meditations focused on

unwinding with God and preparing users for bed in the evening. This includes Night Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours, as well as Examens, Lectio Divinas, and Christian Meditations focused on the end of the day. And also Bible sleep stories led by Catholics you might be familiar with, including Fr. Mike Schmitz, Jonathan Roumie (actor who plays Jesus in The Chosen), Annie Deddens, and Lisa Hendey.

4. <u>Challenges</u>: Areas of the faith that we may be familiar with, but want to dive deeper into. Includes the Our Father (9 sessions, each focused on one line of the prayer), the Stations of the Cross (14 individual stations), the Saints (meditations on the prayers of 9 different saints), and the Psalms (3 meditations on specific



psalms). Also includes a 9-day intro to contemplative prayer challenge that is part of Hallow Lite.

You may now download the app from the App Store or Google play on your phone, tablet or computer. It is free. An email address is all you need. No credit card required.

<u>The Feast of St. Blaise</u> (February 3, 2021) St <u>Blaise</u> is the patron saint of throat diseases. Due

St Blaise is the patron saint of throat diseases. Due to the pandemic, the diocese has issued certain modifications in this year's blessing of the throat.

While still doing the individual blessing of the throat, we will adhere to the following procedure. At the conclusion of Mass, after the dismissal, the Priest and all receiving the blessing should wear masks. A distance of six feet should be maintained. The candles are held in the shape of a cross and tied together with a ribbon. Candles are not lit, and the prayer "Through the intercession of Saint Blaise ..."

is said over each person while maintaining distance. It must be restated explicitly that candles may not be touched to the neck of any member of the faithful, and then touched to the neck of another. This would be a direct violation of the pandemic protocols now in place in our region.

Ash Wednesday (February 17, 2021)

There seems to be some anticipation and talk of what procedure is to be followed for Ash Wednesday. Because of space limitation, it will be discussed more extensively next week. But what you could do now is research on your own what other Catholic Churches in Europe and some Latin American countries do as an alternative to the imposition of ashes on the forehead. It will be interesting if you can also look into some references to Scripture of ways people expressed penance, or showed that one is penitent and is in mourning.
