Dear parishioners,

February 14, 2021 is the Feast Day of our patron saints, <u>Saint Cyril</u> and Saint Methodius. To commemorate this, in all of the Masses this weekend, we will be saying special prayers in

their honor and incensing the icon by the main entrance of the Church. As they showed their love for God's Word and His people by translating the Bible and making liturgical texts accessible to the Slavs, may we also become bearers of the Word to those who may not have access to it and find ways "to bring the universal love preached by Christ" to everyone.

Ash Wednesday (February 17, 2021)

Because of the instruction from the

Vatican and due to the current state of the pandemic, this year the Diocese of Rockville Centre will administer ashes to the faithful by sprinkling the blessed ashes on the top of the head of the recipient.

In the Diocese of Rockville Centre this year, it is not permitted to impose ashes on the forehead of a member of the faithful with the thumb of the hand, even if that hand is gloved. Hands and gloves would be considered "contaminated" after each imposition of ashes if physical contact were made. Please follow the schedule of services as indicated below.

Next week, at the 9:30 Mass, we will have the Rite of Election. This is the conclusion of the Period of the Catechumenate in the **RCIA** (Rite of



Christian Initiation of Adults). This year, for the Parish of Saints Cyril and Methodius, we have two Catechumens, Jason Denes and Jason Yu, whose names will be recorded in the Book of the Elect. This is a very significant step in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is usually celebrated on the first Sunday of Lent at the local diocesan cathedral, led by the local bishop. This year, because of pandemic restrictions, the diocese has delegated the pastor or his representative to celebrate this Rite in our own home parish. The two Catechumens and their Godparents and Sponsors gather together on this day and joins the parish congregation. The Church formally ratifies the Catechumens' readiness for the

Sacraments of Initiation. In turn the Catechumens

– from now on known as the Elect – publicly
acknowledge their desire to receive the
Sacraments of Initiation.






The annual, monthly, and family subscription options are not relevant during the signup process as the parish has made Hallow Plus available for free through the start of Easter






Step 5: Click "Unlock Now".


