Reflection on the Gospel of Luke 24:35-48

On the third Sunday of Easter, we continue to hear Gospel accounts of Jesus' appearances to his disciples following his Resurrection. Today's reading, taken from the Gospel of Luke, follows immediately after the report of Jesus' appearance to his disciples on the road to Emmaus. This is the event being recounted by the disciples in the opening verse of today's Gospel.

Consistently in the reports of Jesus' post-Resurrection appearances, Jesus greets his disciples with the words, "Peace be with you." This is a most appropriate greeting. The disciples have witnessed the death of someone they loved, and they now fear for their own lives as well. Peace is what they need more than anything else. Jesus often connects this greeting of peace with another gift—forgiveness. In today's Gospel, this connection is made in the final verses.

Even as they hear Jesus' greeting of peace, the disciples are startled and terrified. They are uncertain about what to make of the figure before them and, quite understandably, they mistake Jesus for a ghost. Yet the figure before them is not a ghost; Jesus invites them to experience his resurrected body with their senses, to look and to touch. The figure before them is flesh and bone, still bearing the marks of crucifixion. Although the disciples cannot forget his suffering and death, peace begins to take root in their hearts, as their fears turn to joy and amazement.

As further proof of his identity and of his resurrected body, Jesus eats with his disciples.

The disciples have known Jesus best through the meals that he has shared with them. Descriptions of these meals are a defining element of Luke's Gospel. By eating with his disciples after his Resurrection, Jesus recalls all these meals, and most importantly, he recalls the Last Supper.

Luke's report of the Last Supper and the meals that Jesus shared after his Resurrection unveil for us the significance of the Eucharist. Having shared a meal with his disciples, Jesus now uncovers for them the significance of what was written about him in the Scriptures. So, too, our celebration of the Mass is an encounter with Jesus, through the Word and the Sacra-

ment of the Eucharist. As Jesus commissions his disciples to be witnesses to what Scriptures foretold, our celebration of the Eucharist commissions us. Like the disciples, we are sent to announce the good news of Jesus' forgiveness of sins.

Society of St. Vincent de Paul - "We Help People"

In 1832, a cholera epidemic swept through Paris, France, killing up to 1200 people a day. A young university student, Blessed Frederic Ozanam, was deeply moved at the suffering and poverty caused by the epidemic and the poor economic conditions. It was the taunt of an anti-religious opponent in a debating society that spurred Ozanam to action: "You are right Ozanam when you speak of the past! In former times Christianity worked wonders, but what is it doing for mankind now? And you, who pride yourself on your Catholicity, what are you doing now for the poor? Show us your works." Shortly thereafter, on April 23, 1833, Ozanam and a group of six fellow students decided to form an organization dedicated to help the poor. The group took the name of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul after the patron saint of Christian charity. They sought the advice of Sister Rosalie Rendu, who was already visiting poor families in Paris. She introduced them to people they could assist. Within ten years, the Society spread across Europe. In 1846, the Society came to the United States, with the first conference located in St. Louis. From its humble origins 175 years ago, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul has become a worldwide organization with over 800,000 members dedicated to the spiritual advancement of its members and to providing assistance to the poor and needy. Our Parish conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul is proud to follow in the footsteps of those brave individuals who decided to dedicate themselves to the service of others.
