Readings this Sunday

1st Reading: Exodus 20:1-17 (or shorter form, Exodus 20:1-3,7-8,12-17) Moses is given the Ten Commandments.

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:22-25 Paul preaches Christ crucified to the Corinthians.

Gospel Reading: John 2:13-25 Jesus drives out the moneychangers from the Temple and says that he will destroy the temple and raise it up again. Dear Parishioners,

Jesus Christ is risen today! Halleluiah! Halleluiah!

I would like to to greet everyone a Happy Easter! May this time truly be a rebirth for us all. May it bring us true comfort and security when things are not stable, unwavering hope confronted with darkness, and reconciliation and unity when we are in turmoil from hate and division.

As Christians, there are two dominant symbols that are most associated with Easter. First is the Empty Tomb and second the Paschal Lamb.

On the third day after his crucifixion, the women who had been followers went to his tomb and found it empty. They told the disciples, some of whom also went to the tomb and found it empty. And they left wondering what had happened to Jesus' body? Why is the empty tomb important? Its primary importance is that it points to the bodily resurrection of Jesus. That death could not hold him. And because Jesus has risen, we can look forward to our own resurrection as well. The empty tomb demonstrates that death is not the end of the journey. There is much more to come. This Sunday, as you return the nails that were given to you on Holy Friday, you profess of the truth of the empty tomb: Death has no power over Christ!
