I have important requests for needs of our clients. Before I ask this I want to prefacis this by saying this is not going to be a forum for anyone seeking to put their items or requests in the bulletin. These are needs that I have an obligation to help with as the director of parish ministry.

If anyone knows of a one or two bedroom apartment that may be available in the near future please reach out to me. This is for three adults. A couple and their adult son. The wife has cancer and is undergoing chemotherapy. They are currently in a shelter in Wading River. However, her doctors are here in Deer Park and before they lost their home were residents of Deer Park. It is very difficult for them to keep traveling here for her appointments as she is quite ill. The most they can pay is \$1600/mo.

My second request is for a young couple that is pregnant and homeless. They are in need of a one bedroom or even a studio apartment for up to \$1000/mo.

Housing is very hard to come by in the present environment.

As you know I am looking for 2 commercial refrigerators to accommodate the growing number of refrigerated items that you are providing to the pantry.

Right now I am also in need of two grocery carts with wheels for our clients who walk to the pantry. These are the type of carts you generally see city dwellers use.

I also need at least two people who have the time to visit with elderly clients. These would be companion visits and not aides. They are just lonely and need some company.

I am also seeking people who may have time to deliver food to people who are no longer able to get to the pantry.

If you would be kind enough to pass these requests along to the community I would be very grateful.

May God bless you abundantly for all you do for the less fortunate.
