Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we welcome Rev. David Regan who will be presiding at the 11:00 am Mass.

Fr. Dave grew up in North Babylon, NY. After college he spent time ministering-working as a layperson in the Missionary Diocese of Fairbanks, Alaska. During that time, he helped coordinate the Diocesan pilgrimage from the Missionary Diocese to World Youth Day 2002, Toronto. It was there that he affirmed what was in his heart since the time of his first Holy Communion. He was assured of his calling to the priesthood.



After being ordained in 2010 he served at St. Patrick's RC Church in Smithtown. His time there was filled with challenges and profound joy. In addition, he was asked to be the chaplain at Stony Brook University. Through him and the team the Catholic Campus Ministry build and maintained the first Catholic Eucharistic Chapel in the NY university system.

Fr. Dave Regan served the people of Sacred Heart in North Merrick briefly and was invited to become the pastor of St. Gertrude's in Bayville. Serving the people there was a beautiful moment in his life. Fr. Regan states that "...watching God's grace thrive in the lives of his parish members is what brought him the most happiness... each moment has the potential for God's grace if only we are ready and open."

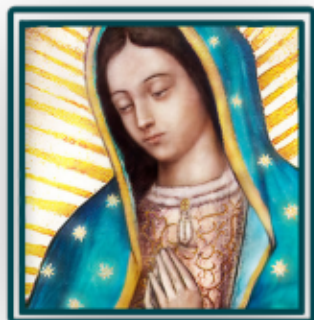

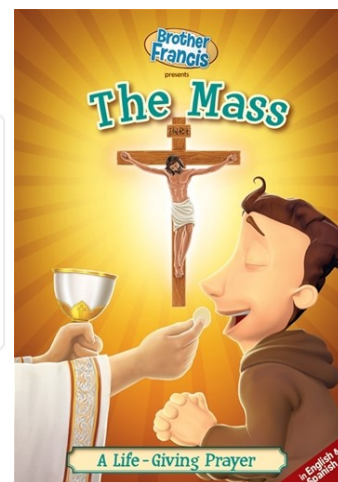
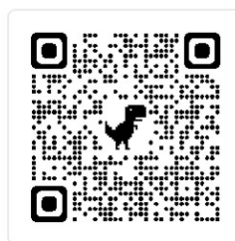

Family FORMED Recommendation

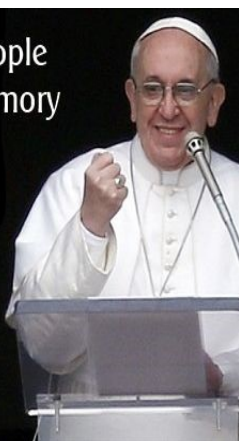

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER of HOLY COMMUNION

Training Opportunities - Fall 2021

This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This “BASIC” training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend “SPECIALIZED” training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend BASIC training prior to SPECIALIZED training. Plans for SPECIALIZED training will be communicated in a separate memo.

Doors will open one half hour prior to start time so that attendees can check-in and pick up materials.

Those 18 years and above, interested in serving the parish as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion should request to be registered for this training. Please call the parish rectory for more information.

Society of St. Vincent de Paul — “We Help People”

There are multiple governmental programs available for individuals and families in need of assistance. Eligibility information and information on submitting an application is often available online, which can save a trip to the local office of the Department of Social Services.

- Information on the SNAP program (food stamps) and on the HEAP program (which provides seasonal assistance with heating bills), can be obtained at www.mybenefits.ny.gov. Effective October 1, 2021, SNAP benefits will increase by an average of about \$36 per person per month. The HEAP program is not open yet, but will be available in early November, as the weather gets colder. If you are struggling financially to provide your family with basic necessities, please check out this website.
- The New York State Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) will provide significant economic relief to help low and moderate-income households at risk of experiencing homelessness or housing instability resulting from the pandemic by providing rental arrears, temporary rental assistance and utility arrears assistance. The program also benefits landlords who have been adversely affected by the pandemic. Eligibility and application information can be found on line at <https://otda.ny.gov>.
- The State has a grant program (Excluded Workers Fund) to assist residents who lost income during the pandemic, but who did not receive benefits from the various federal relief programs such as unemployment benefits or stimulus checks. To inquire about this program, call the Economic Opportunity Council of Suffolk at 631-842-6100 or visit <https://dol.ny.gov/EWF>.

Because governmental aid programs tend to provide longer term financial assistance than our limited resources allow, one of the things that our Parish conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul does is to educate individuals and families in need about these programs and to offer advice and assistance in applying.

New York State's moratorium on the Covid related eviction of tenants has recently been extended to January 15, 2022. This does not mean that tenants are not obligated to pay rent, but does mean that under the prescribed circumstances they cannot be evicted for failing to pay rent. PSEG has suspended termination of service for non-payment until the end of the year. Customers currently with arrears are encouraged to pay anything they can to lessen the amount owed.
