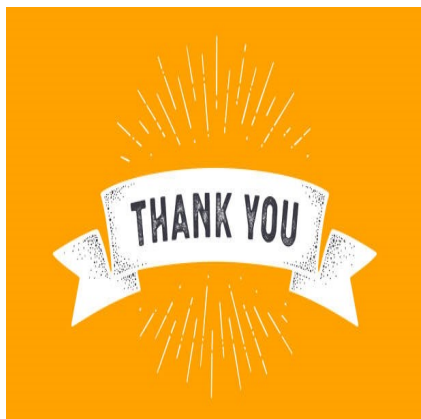

Society of St. Vincent de Paul - "We Help People"

In keeping with the motto of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul - "No act of charity is foreign to the Society" - our Parish conference offers a wide variety of services to qualified individuals and families in Deer Park and North Babylon. Among the services that we provide are:

1. Assistance with making rent and mortgage payments. Through a combination of grant programs and our local funds, we provide short-term assistance to eligible individuals having trouble making rent and mortgage payments.
2. Assistance with paying other necessary bills. We use our local funds received through donations and fund-raising activities to assist individuals/families in danger of having their electricity/gas/water service terminated because of an inability to make required payments. The types of assistance we provide cover a wide range of situations. For example, we have helped families pay to have their cesspools pumped out; we have paid co-pays on medicines; and we have paid for car repairs or car insurance when use of the vehicle is essential to allow an individual to work or to go to medical appointments.
3. Furniture. We coordinate with the Diocesan Council of the Society to provide furniture to individuals/families in need.
4. Clothing. We provide clothing vouchers to individuals/families in need which can be redeemed at the St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Shop in Huntington.
5. Dental Services. The Diocesan Council runs a dental program for persons in need with no dental insurance.
6. Homeless Outreach. Together with other local ministries, we help address the needs of the homeless in our community.
7. Advocacy for individuals seeking grants or governmental assistance. We coordinate with other agencies to provide assistance when we cannot, and we help families and individuals navigate the governmental bureaucracy to apply for grant programs and assistance which may be available.
8. Housing assistance. We do not provide direct housing referrals, but can direct individuals/families to agencies and programs that may be able to help.

This list is not all inclusive and we always strive to be creative in finding new ways to help our neighbors. We hope that this information gives you a more tangible idea of the assistance that we provide and that is available to families and individuals in Deer Park and North Babylon. If you want to get personally involved in our mission, or if you want information on how to make a financial donation to support our mission, call the number listed below. Finally, we thank everyone for the continued financial support which allows us to help our neighbors, and we thank those who remember us and those of our neighbors who are experiencing tough times in their prayers.
