STATE OF THE PARISH

It has been a little over 2 years since I took over Saints Cyril and Methodius parish as pastor. And as the fiscal year has just recently ended, I realize that it is time to make a personal assessment of where the parish is and to look at the various aspects of the parish to recognize and encourage the good work that has been contributed, to be aware of the challenges that we continue to grapple with and likewise to see the areas that need attention, revision, and improvement. I was not able to do this last year as everyone's attention was concentrated on the pandemic - on how to deal with it, how to operate as a parish with it, how to continue to function as Church despite the many restrictions and limitations that we needed to put in place. We are still a long way to go in dealing with this challenge, but I believe we

are in a slightly better place now than where we were last year.

This assessment will be lengthy and will thus be published in parts. There will be areas that will not be touched at the present time but for sure will be dealt with in the future.

Let us start with our financial status. The pandemic has certainly made a great impact on the finances of the parish and has also affected operations. Collections went down which is what happened in all other parishes in Long Island, and we needed to cut or reduce many expenses while not neglecting necessary operations and maintenance. We successfully applied for and received two PPP Loans (Pandemic relief from the government) that covered payroll (for both parish and school), paid the employees medical benefits and operational costs for a certain period of time. We were also fortunate to have received generous

grants from the Norma Pace Foundation and multiple times from a very generous parishioner. We are a big parish and maintenance is costly. Without the loans and the grants, we would be in the red now.

But in my assessment, all things considered - even with the fact that for many months we were not allowed to have congregational gatherings in Church; and even when numbers in weekend Mass attendance have not gone back up to where we would like it to be – weekend collection has been stable. And this is because people have been consistently generous. In fact, more than generous. Parishioners have religiously mailed in or dropped off their weekly envelopes and used the electronic giving portal on our website. Your generosity warms my heart.

We needed to be creative with our fundraising efforts since relying on the collection alone is not sufficient. We were not able to hold the Family Festival for the past two years and Bingo was also put on hold. These are two of our major sources of added income. But the parish raffles have been very well received and continue to be supported by many. We found ways of celebrating and raising some money as well – through the two musical concerts (one by the parish and one virtually by the school) that we staged. We also did two 5k fun runs and Makers Market. We also did the Banquet at the Inner Garden which everyone who came enjoyed. The grocery bags continue to be sold. And we were able to hold our annual Msgr. Ted Rooney Golf Outing. We owe the success of these not only because people supported them but because many volunteered their time and talent to make them happen. The Portal of Saints catechize but also improved the look of the school entrance from the breezeway and raised some money as well. The 2020 Easter collection was very low from what we had projected as people were still unsure about coming back to Church. But the response for the 2020 Christmas appeal (1000 100s) has been overwhelming. This appeal made up for the loss at Easter. We are very pleased with the return of Bingo last month as this truly will alleviate the parish finances since all of the proceeds will now go exclusively to the parish. But we need more volunteers for it to be sustained. We continue to explore other ways to raise additional income for the parish.

The matter of the school will be discussed in the coming weeks but suffice it for now to say that with reduced financial support that we give to the school, hopefully our fundraiser efforts will be limited to some degree in the future.

Over-all, at least at the present time, we are in a relatively stable place financially. But financial conditions are volatile. Let us not rest our laurels but continue to be supportive and work hard for our parish to be stable and operate efficiently. Above all, with stable finances, we should aim to do well with the ministerial works of charity and evangelical mission that we are meant to do. Again, for all your continuing support and overflowing generosity, I am truly grateful. Let us remember, the Lord can never be outdone in his generosity for us.
