STATE OF THE PARISH – Part 2

This week I would like to discuss with you about the situation of the school and how the parish stands in relation to it.

A brief background: As we were ending the school year 2020-2021, we made the difficult decision to close the parish school but announced a hopeful direction with its rebirth into what we now know as Our Lady of Guadalupe School. It was painful on us and has brought many troubles to others as well. But it was inevitable considering the radical decrease in the number of enrollment due to the economic crisis brought by the pandemic. We had around 174 enrollees for the school year 2020-2021. For the school to operate with ease – to pay teachers and staff salaries and benefits, to pay for maintenance and daily operational expenditures - at a minimum we needed at least 200

students, which still presumes an even more aggressive fundraising effort that we were doing in the past to subsidize it. As you know, there was pressure to close the school at the beginning of the school year. But the parish lay council advised against it. And so, we resisted the pressure and we remained open. And we tried to be creative and we all worked hard to sustain it. But the initial turn-out in enrollment for the new school year was extremely low and a show of interest was slow as well. And there was a bleak projection of what can happen this year and in the next few years. The school may end up dragging the parish down.

It was here that the Morning Star Initiative (MSI) approached us with a promising offer of taking over, creating a new "regional" school participated in by other neighboring parishes (St. John of God Parish, Central Islip, St Anne Parish and St

Luke Parish in Brentwood and St Peter the Apostle Parish, Islip Terrace). This means that these parishes will now participate in promoting and subsidizing the school. This also means the usual amount the parish gives annually to the school is lessened. Further, it means less responsibility for the parish in its daily operation as now the school is to be run by the MSI team and the Department of Education of the diocese. We still own the school physical property and assist in its maintenance, which has its own advantages as I would explain later. Because it is no longer a parochial school, decisions about curriculum, about who they hire, about operational matters no longer rest on us but completely in the hands of the new administration and the MSI team. If the management decisions take on a new direction which is different from how it was before, it is no longer in our hands but something that we need to respect and support.

Not having a parish school does not mean we give up everything that has to do with Catholic Education. For Catholic Education is an essential part of our Missionary identity as Church. We lose something of who we are if we don't show support for it. In fact, even if we did not have a school, we would still have to send our share to subsidize the schools of the diocese. Belonging to the cluster of parishes that support Our Lady of Guadalupe School means, the subsidy stays here and goes straight to our school. Besides, since they are here, it is still our school. Their presence and their collaboration with the parish will still benefit the parish and its parishioners.

About the lease: We have agreed not to receive any, well in fact the contract says \$1. For two main reasons. One, receiving rent may limit our use of the property. As you know, we still need it for religious education. We need the gym for our CYO. Likewise, we need to use the auditorium in the basement for parish affairs, meetings and events. And two, as the school is new and would need to take off, we felt it was most charitable not to collect rent for now. This will help find their footing and truly move forward. The lease that we signed explicitly says we can revisit and review it annually. In a few years, we hope the school will be in a better position, when it is able to independently sustain itself, and then we can negotiate to have the no rent clause be the only financial subsidy that we give them.

Our Lady of Guadalupe operates two campuses. As of now, both eastern campus (Central Islip) and western campus (Deer Park) have just about 400 kids enrolled. Such a big difference from our own numbers last year. Remember that MSI is spearheaded by the Marianist brothers who successfully operate Chaminade, Kellenberg and Martin de Pores Schools. And because they have the experience and have their own machinery, the projection is that enrollment will only grow more in the next few years. And that is our hope and prayer as well. For we DO want quality Catholic education to touch minds, hearts and lives of more children in Long Island. When this happens, don't we all think, a bright future awaits the church of Long Island as well?

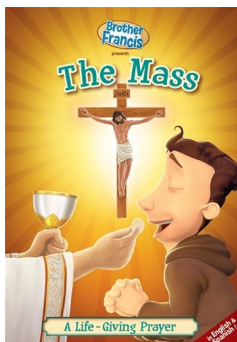

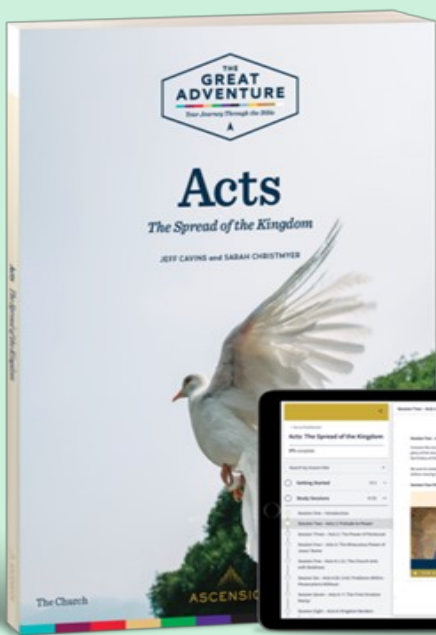
