STATE OF THE PARISH – Part 3

On my third installment of the state of the parish, I would like us to look at improvements made on some parts of the parish physical plant and future priority upgrades that we feel we need to invest in.

At the beginning of my term as pastor, I felt that since the Eucharistic Celebration is at the heart of who we are as a parish, that some tweaking needed to be done with where things are in the sanctuary and how things are perceived from the pews. And so, we made more prominent the two central points of the Eucharist, namely the lectern and the altar table, to highlight the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. For visibility and prominence, toppers were added for both and likewise platforms were built to elevate them. The presider's chair was moved to the right and so too the baptismal font was moved. We added a custommade ambry to hold the precious oils used in the sacramental celebrations. And finally, spotlights were added for better visibility.

The technology that was created to livestream our Masses, a need that came about due to the pandemic, was made possible because of a team of generous people who gave time, talent and treasure. Thank you to Russell Salerno and Peter Mercado for making what we have today one if not the best livestreaming of the Mass in Long Island. They would like to ask for more people who are interested to join them, to learn a new skill and to make it a real communications ministry.

The narthex (main entrance lobby) was also improved. First, by moving the statues of St. Joseph and St. Patrick, placing them against the outside walls and putting them on functional and



elegant pedestals. Two large monitors were installed that weekly project information about the parish and upcoming events. The lower half of the bulletin stands that held trash bins were also covered. It was, for me, unsightly and unwelcoming, that at all the doors of the church, trash bins were exposed and were the first things that one can see when entering the Church. Also recently, the generous donation of Andrew and Matthew Kabacinski of a Peter Gray original painting of the twin hearts of Jesus and Mary that now hang above the main door completes the welcoming feel of the Church entrance that we want it to be. The metal doors were also repainted with a neutral color. And soon to be mounted on them will be a 3D replica of the round emblem of Saints Cyril and Methodius which is what we see on the grills that is the backdrop of the sanctuary. For this, Russell Salerno, thank you for your artistry.

Through the very generous donation of Mangano Funeral Home, we now have an electronic board outside the Church that inform and advertise to all passing by Deer Park Avenue who we are as a Parish and what events we invite people to participate in. It is updated on a weekly basis.

Not a long time ago, a much-needed renovation was made to the priest's sacristy. Through the generous help of two parishioners, whose names I was asked to withhold, the renovation was made possible. We made individual cabinets for every clergy to keep their sacred vestments since before everything was mixed. A more decent and proper storage for our sacred vessels was also created. The walls were repainted, and the outdated and dirty carpet was removed and changed to wood veneers. A parishioner also volunteered his time and skill to re-do the table drawers. Reducing its size gave us more space while still making it orderly to hold stoles, books and made preparing for every liturgical celebration easier.

Respecting the wishes of a generous donor, the kitchen of the rectory building was just updated. It was her wish that the money she was giving go directly to making the kitchen something that the clergy residents could enjoy and use to bond together. She had a hand in how it was renovated from its conception to its completion. We thank her and assure her of our continued prayers.

Early this year, I had moved the offices to the rectory for various reasons: one, to economize. There were only a few people that really occupied the pastoral center building and there were a lot of vacant rooms. Moving the staff to the rectory reduced maintenance expenses. Two, I felt it was more efficient to have offices in the rectory. Many times, it became a struggle to go to the pastoral center for appointments and small needs like blessing religious articles. Now it has become more convenient for priests to meet with their appointments with the present set-up. Third, I had always wanted to open the office on Sunday since I knew people were already here attending the Mass. The rectory is easier to access from the Church if people need to transact business with the office.

You may have seen the sign that says that the pastoral center building is up for lease. We feel that this move will provide a sizeable and steady extra parish income. If a good deal pushes through, then the parish will truly benefit from it and will be a good reason to take it easy on some of our fundraising efforts. Currently the Social Ministry Office holds office on the first floor. We will be able to find a new space for them from our other buildings if a lease offer is approved.

Of the future many projects and upkeep that we need to do, I would like to direct your attention to two immediate needs. First, I have heard the clamor of many people coming to Mass of the need for one other or more bathrooms. Currently there is only one which is by the main entrance. Security complications make us refrain

from opening the bathrooms by the gym. And so, there are two spots that we are currently looking at where we can build them. The first is by the breezeway door to the school parking lot. And the second is to the right of the entrance from the main parking lot by Walgreens. This project is costly but is a necessity. And second, we know that we need to refinish our parking lots. Currently there are quite a few cracks and potholes, damages brought by the weather. And we have been doing patch work to resolve this. But the best and safest solution is to do the entire lot. These two are priorities since they are needed and used by parishioners regularly. Again, please expect us to come to you for help with these two major projects.

It is so important that we do not allow anyone or any family to feel that no one cares for them. We do care. We do want to welcome them. This is not about being monetarily poor. Of course we are always going to take care of our poor. I am talking about people who are in need of caring, people who are in spiritual need and those hungry for people to notice that they are lonely. Lonely people rarely reach out.

When my husband was transferred to California from New York we were 3 thousand miles away from family and friends. Our family was very lonely. For the first time we were alone for the holiday's. Then our new parish had an open invitation for people and families to come to the parish to share a meal. We made many friends and not only friends that were in our situation but also people that were the volunteers at that meal. We met single people, widows, widowers, families all from different walks of life. You would probably be surprised at how many people are just waiting for someone to reach out and care. So, please reach out to me so we can welcome people into a very loving and caring community that we call Ss. Cyril and Methodius.

We are going to have such a meal here at the parish. More details to follow! Do your part and let me know who the people in the community are that we would love to welcome and get to know!

The nights will consist of Eucharistic Adoration with praise and worship and inspiring talks, followed by games and refreshments. Each hub parish has a unique team of veteran youth ministers, worship leaders, and faithful young adults who will facilitate the night. The initiative officially kicked off on Friday, October 8th at St. Barnabas, with the other locations offering theirs in the weeks that follow.

The Office of Youth Ministry has been hosting information sessions for parish leaders to learn and discuss how they can make the most of the initiative. Youth ministers, catechetical leaders, priests, parents, and other adult leaders will have the opportunity to accompany the youth (grades 8-12) of their parish to each INSPIRE night and use the event as a vehicle to build relationships with the teens and their families. Local follow-up to these nights is encouraged and some resources will be provided.
