

Please join us in the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on November 1 Feast of All Saints. This day is dedicated to all the Saints, who from a canon/criteria followed by the Church are recognized to have reached our final heavenly destination. They are models for us who continue to journey in this earthly life and also intercessors of heavenly favors.

Generally, All Saints' Day is a Catholic Holy Day of Obligation, meaning all Catholics are required to attend Mass on that day, with the usual dispensations for valid reasons such as illness. 250 SAINTS

5:30 pm - Spiritual Talk on The Fascinating Experience of the Sacred Relics



As we celebrate All Saints' Day, I am happy to offer to everyone a unique opportunity to venerate and pray to over 250 First Class Relics of Saints. These are personal collections under the care of two friends from the Archdiocese of Newark: Fr Manolo Punzalan, Pastor of the Immaculate Conception Parish in Mahwah and Fr. Ryan dela Pena, administrator of Immaculate Heart of Mary/St. Patrick Church in Elizabeth, NJ. Both have graciously allowed us to have them exposed for veneration here in our parish. Fr Ryan has also agreed to give us a spiritual talk about the catholic practice of veneration of relics.

There are three classes of sacred relics. The **first-class** is a part of the saints body. The **second-class** is a piece of the saints clothing or something used by the saint, while the **third-class** is an object which has been touched to a first-class relic.

The veneration of relics of the saints is found in the early history of the Church. A letter written by the faithful of the Church in Smyrna in the year 156 provides an account of the death of St. Polycarp, their bishop, who was burned at the stake. The letter reads, "We took up the bones, which are more valuable than precious stones and finer than refined gold, and laid them in a suitable place, where the Lord will permit us to gather ourselves together as we are able, in gladness and joy, and celebrate the birthday of his martyrdom." Other accounts attest that the faithful visited the burial places of the saints and miracles occurred.

In a technological age, the whole idea of relics may seem strange. Yet we are reminded that we treasure things that have belonged to someone we love—a piece of clothing, a personal item, a lock of hair. Those "relics" remind us of the love we share with that person while he was still living and even when the loved one passed. Our hearts are torn when we think about disposing of the very personal things of a deceased loved one.

Relics remind us of the holiness of saints and their cooperation in God's work. Moreso, relics inspire us to ask for the saints' intercessory prayers and to beg the grace of God to live the same kind of faith-filled life

SAINTS ARE OUR FRIENDS

Saints have been Catholics' companions on our faith journeys since the earliest days of Christianity. Catholics are fortunate to have so many friends. We have a close, personal, intimate relationship with our favorite saints. We trust our favorite saints, we have confidence in them, we regard them as faithful friends who stand ready to use their influence on our behalf. How do the saints exert their influence? They pray with us, they pray for us and they present our petitions to God, whom they see face to face. It is a remarkable thing, that glorified souls in heaven are willing to come to the assistance of sinful souls here on earth.

Our friendship with the saints is rooted in a theological concept: the Communion of Saints. But what is it? The short answer is the Catholic Church is the Communion of Saints. We here on earth, the souls in purgatory and the souls in heaven are all united in one sacred community. All of us in the Communion of Saints share a common faith — it is one of two things that bind us together. The second bond is charity, in the sense of compassion. It is compassion that moves us on earth and the saints in heaven to pray for the souls in purgatory, to hasten their time of purification so they can reach the glory of God's kingdom. Compassion also moves the saints to intercede for us, pleading with Almighty God to assist us in times of trouble and grant us the graces we need to remain faithful to him so we can be united with him forever in heaven. We know that great saints, on their deathbed, actually looked forward to the good they could do for us once they reached heaven. "Do not weep," the dying St. Dominic told his brother Dominicans, "for I shall be more useful to you after my death and I shall help you more effectively than during my life."

Jesus tells us: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength . . . and you shall love your neighbor yourself." This past month, we have helped three individuals/families to pay their rent, we arranged for an emergency delivery of oil to a family, and we have helped an individual forced out of her apartment to pay storage charges so she would not lose her personal property. Both Vincentian and neighbor are also blessed and supported by your most beautiful spiritual gift of prayer. All support is greatly appreciated.

Once again, remember that the Christmas Holiday Fair is returning on Sunday, November 28, 2021. This will be the perfect opportunity to buy unique holiday crafts and gifts made locally. The Fair is also the most important fundraising event of the year for our Parish conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. It generates funds which we use to help our neighbors in Deer Park and North Babylon. The Office of Youth Ministry has been hosting information sessions for parish leaders to learn and discuss how they can make the most of the initiative. Youth ministers, catechetical leaders, priests, parents, and other adult leaders will have the opportunity to accompany the youth (grades 8-12) of their parish to each INSPIRE night and use the event as a vehicle to build relationships with the teens and their families. Local follow-up to these nights is encouraged and some resources will be provided.
