The issue of mental illness manifests themselves in many ways in our community: drug use and dependency, alcoholism, homelessness, suicides and many more. It affects people of all ages and races. It is a long-standing issue. And for sure, it has affected many for quite for a long time

now. But everything was aggravated and made worse by the pandemic. As people are locked down, as their usual routines have been disrupted, as a stable future is doubted and put into question, people have become anxious and depressed and in effect disruptive. Many have started to behave erratically in road rages, fits of anger, combative attitudes, overblown negativity and being critical and resentful of everything.

The difficulty with this issue lies in the fact that it is in front of our faces, but we dismiss it or brush it aside because we do not know exactly how we should properly respond to it. When one of our own - a family member, a loved one, a friend, a Church member - is the

one going through it, our ability to act and respond properly is stifled. Most times, we rationalize or often spiritualize the issue, and just say let us just pray for them. Because its less trouble, most times, we easily give in when they beg for a quick fix. But in effect we "enable" them which makes the situation worse. The other extreme is the easy way out which is to call on the cops to let them handle it. But aren't there other and better solutions and ways of handling it? Personally, I do not know the answer. But we, as one parish, could all look into it?

What I wish to do is to form a committee that will pro-actively find ways that will bring awareness about the issue of Mental Illness to





This Veterans Day, Help us Support A Place to Call Home

Charles spent 17 years deployed at military bases throughout the world. Returning home after an incident involving nerve gas, he began struggling with debilitating bouts of anxiety and depression.

His circumstances worsened and he couldn't maintain a steady job. Charles moved in with his mother, but within a year she died and his childhood home went into foreclosure.

Catholic Charities' *Project Veterans' Independence*, which guides homeless veterans into permanent housing so they can live independently and have access to support networks that get them back on their feet, reached out and helped Charles.

"I was out of the service, out of a family, out of a job and out of a home. Catholic Charities found me and helped me to not only find a place to live - but they helped me to turn my life around."
