Dear Parishioners,

I would like to remind everyone of the schedule for the next two weeks.

This year Christmas, December 25th falls on a Saturday. We have 3 Masses on the eve of Christmas, the 24th of December. First Mass is at 4:00 pm which is traditionally our Family Mass. There is also one at 6:00 pm, and finally, one at 10:00 pm which is a concelebrated Mass. There is no midnight Mass on the 24th. This year, I have decided to do the evening Mass earlier at 10:00 pm instead of midnight because the next 2 days will be very hectic and loaded.

On December 25th, Christmas Day, we have 4 Masses – 8:00 am, 9:30 am, 11:00 and the last Mass of the day is at 12:30 pm. On Christmas day, there is no 4:00 pm Confessions and no 5:00 pm Mass. The following day, Sunday, December 26th, is the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. This does not happen often, that Christmas is followed immediately, the following day by another great and important Feast. On the 26th, we will follow the usual Sunday Mass schedule of 8:00 am, 9:30 am, 11:00 am, 12:30 pm and 6:00 pm.

The following weekend will have a similar occurrence as Saturday, January 1st is the feast of Mary, Mother of God. Masses for the feast includes a Vigil Mass the day before, December 31st at 5:00 pm and 8:30 am on the Feast Day itself.

The following day, Sunday, January 2nd Is the Feast of the Epiphany. Masses will be the usual Sunday schedule: 5:00 pm on the day before (December 31), and 8:00 am, 9:30 am, 11:00 am,





Hello again everyone!

Thank you to everyone that have been dropping off their wrapped gifts from the tags on the giving trees. It is very heartwarming to say the least.

<u>Please bring your wrapped gifts no later than December 17th.</u> Yes I know it is a Friday. I will be here. In fact if you see my red SUV in the parking lot rest assured I am here. So if I am here please feel free to drop in. Everyone is always welcome to see what we are up to over here.

Now having said that I must talk about the giving tree which may seem completely secular. However, it is not entirely so. To Christians, the gifts given during Christmas are symbolic of the three wise men bearing gifts to the baby Jesus.

It may seem as if the tags are never going to end. They have now ended. Although I have recently gotten three new families whose circumstances have become dire within the last week or two there is only so much we can do.

I know I may be criticized for the gifts that are asked for on the giving tree. So as usual there is a method to my madness. No one asks to be born into the circumstances they find themselves. Undoubtedly some adults are in situations due to poor choices. However, that does not change the circumstance for them as we celebrate Christmas. I realize I have asked for a couple of big ticket items. No child wants to feel that they are different. Even though their homes may be very humble they would still like to participate in playing games using technology. If you cannot provide these things I do understand. I just do not want people judging the people who have asked for what they know is probably impossible because they don't want their children to be "less than" the other children. Whether we like it or not people judge. I would never ask anyone to donate more than I would donate myself. Just as when we donate to the Church to keep the lights on so to speak and the programs running, these donations are meant to be given from our need, not our excess. So I am asking you to give what you can and asking that you be kind and realize that the parents want the same kind of Christmas that other children enjoy. Okay off the soap box now.
