On March 2nd, with Ash Wednesday, we shall once again begin our Lenten journey. LENT is precisely that, a journey - one that cannot be taken by anyone else but me, one that requires an effort and intention, one that must teach me to be bold to leave behind certain things, but also be adventurous by taking on and learning or relearning new things.

We have commonly associated LENT with giving up. We ask, "What am I giving up for Lent?" Is it chocolate? is it coffee? Is it dessert? Is it time I waste on social media? Is it gossip? Is it being negative and critical? Is it carbs? Is it laziness? Is it being rude? Is it time I spend on video games? Is it time I spend on window online shopping? Is it wine? Is it alcohol? Is it TV time? Etcetera...etcetera...etcetera. Whatever it is that you are contemplating on giving up now, I have one advice. Just choose one. Don't do 2 or 3 or 4, thinking your chance of success is at better odds if you have a backup. Most times, this strategy always fails. The strategy of the devil is to overwhelm you, since you have so many things you are trying to give up, that end up not giving up anything at all. Just choose one. It is more manageable. But choose one that is not easy. That way it feels more gratifying when you succeed. But the KEY to all this is to dedicate it to God. Allow the grace of God to lead and strengthen you. Don't give it up for your sake. Do it for your love of God. And so, don't look for a reward. Do it because you LOVE the God who you're making the sacrifice for, knowing that He has made much more and greater sacrifices for you, and that His generosity is never matched.

But likewise, as you think about giving up something, you must consider also taking up something. As announced last weekend, the period from now until March 2 is a good opportunity for us to begin the process of discerning what we can do this Lent to prepare for Easter. SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL - "We Help People"

As we are now in the middle of the winter season, many people are experiencing difficulty in heating their homes and paying their PSEG bills. There are several programs available to assist eligible individuals/families. The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) helps low-income people pay the cost of heating their homes. If you are eligible, you may receive one regular HEAP benefit per program year and you could also be eligible for emergency HEAP benefits if you are in danger of running out of fuel or having your utility service shut off. More information is available at otda.ny.gov/ programs/heap or by calling 631-853-8825. The United Way's emergency energy assistance program, Project Warmth is now open, and applications can be submitted through the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Project Warmth offers one time assistance up to \$500 for fuel or \$200 for fuel-related electricity. Applications can be accepted with proof of residency, a severely overdue notice (not a closed account) or near empty oil tank (<1/4 of a tank), and a verifiable explanation of the arrears. For more information, call the number below. If you are having difficulty paying your electric bill, PSEG has a Household Assistance Program. For eligibility and application information visit PSEG's website at psegliny.com.
