ST. JOSEPH

What is it that made Saint Joseph so great? Joseph is not great because he was given such incredible privileges. He was great because of the choices he made in life. The Gospels refer to him as a “righteous man” and as a man who “did as the angel of the Lord commanded him.” Thus, his greatness is primarily on account of his moral righteousness and obedience to the will of God.

Joseph’s obedience is especially seen in the fact that he obeyed the voice of God given to him in the four dreams recorded in Scripture (Matthew 1:20–21), (Matthew 2:13), (Matthew 2:20), (Matthew 2:22).

When these dreams are read in succession, it is clear that Saint Joseph was attentive to the voice of God. His dreams were clear communications from God that required a willing recipient. Joseph was open to the voice of God and listened in faith as that willing recipient.

Joseph also responded with complete submission and full determination. The commands Joseph received were not insignificant. His obedience required that he and his family travel great distances, take up residence in strange lands, and do so all in faith.

It’s also clear that Joseph took his vocation seriously. Pope Saint John Paul II gave him the title “Guardian of the Redeemer.” Over and over, he showed his unwavering commitment to his role as the guardian of his legal Son, Jesus, and of his wife, Mary. His life was spent providing for them, protecting them and offering them a father’s heart.

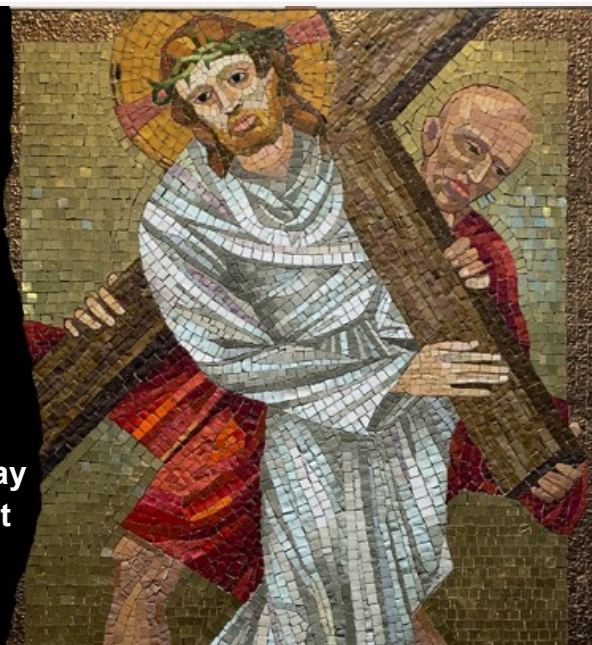

FROM THE PASTOR

ST. PATRICK

Raised in Britain, Patrick was captured by pirates in A.D. 405 when he was only sixteen years old. The kidnappers whisked him away to Ireland and sold Patrick into slavery. He spent eight years as a captive in this pagan land.

During his captivity, Patrick embraced the Christian faith of his upbringing, something that had mattered little to him beforehand. In his own words, Patrick explained: "And there the Lord opened the sense of my unbelief that I might at last remember my sins and be converted with all my heart to the Lord my God, who had regard for my abjection, and mercy on my youth and ignorance, and watched over me before I knew Him, and before I was able to distinguish between good and evil, and guarded me, and comforted me as would a father his son" (from The Confession of St. Patrick).

Inspired by a dream, Patrick finally escaped from Ireland and made his way back to his home in Britain. But, in time, he sensed God's call to return to Ireland, of all places, in order to share the good news of Christ with the pagans there. Even though he feared he wasn't sufficiently learned to be a mis-

sionary, Patrick returned to Ireland, where he found unprecedented success in his evangelistic endeavors. His experience of Irish language and culture during his years as a slave enabled Patrick to communicate the Christian gospel with unusual effectiveness.

Though we can't be sure when Patrick died, tradition holds that he lived into his seventies and died on March 17 in the latter half of the fifth-century A.D. In twenty-five or thirty years of evangelistic work, he led thousands of Irish pagans to Christ and was responsible for Ireland's becoming one of the most Christian nations in Europe. For this reason he is called "the apostle of the Irish."

The story of Patrick reminds us, in a way, of Joseph's experience in Egypt. In both cases, what kidnappers and slave masters intended for evil, God intended for good (Gen. 50:20). Today we celebrate, not only Patrick's example of faithfulness, but also the mystery and majesty of God's redemptive sovereignty. It's not unusual for people who have experienced some particular trauma in life to end up ministering to others who suffer that same trauma. St. Patrick serves as an example of how God can work all things together for good, even things which are quite evil.

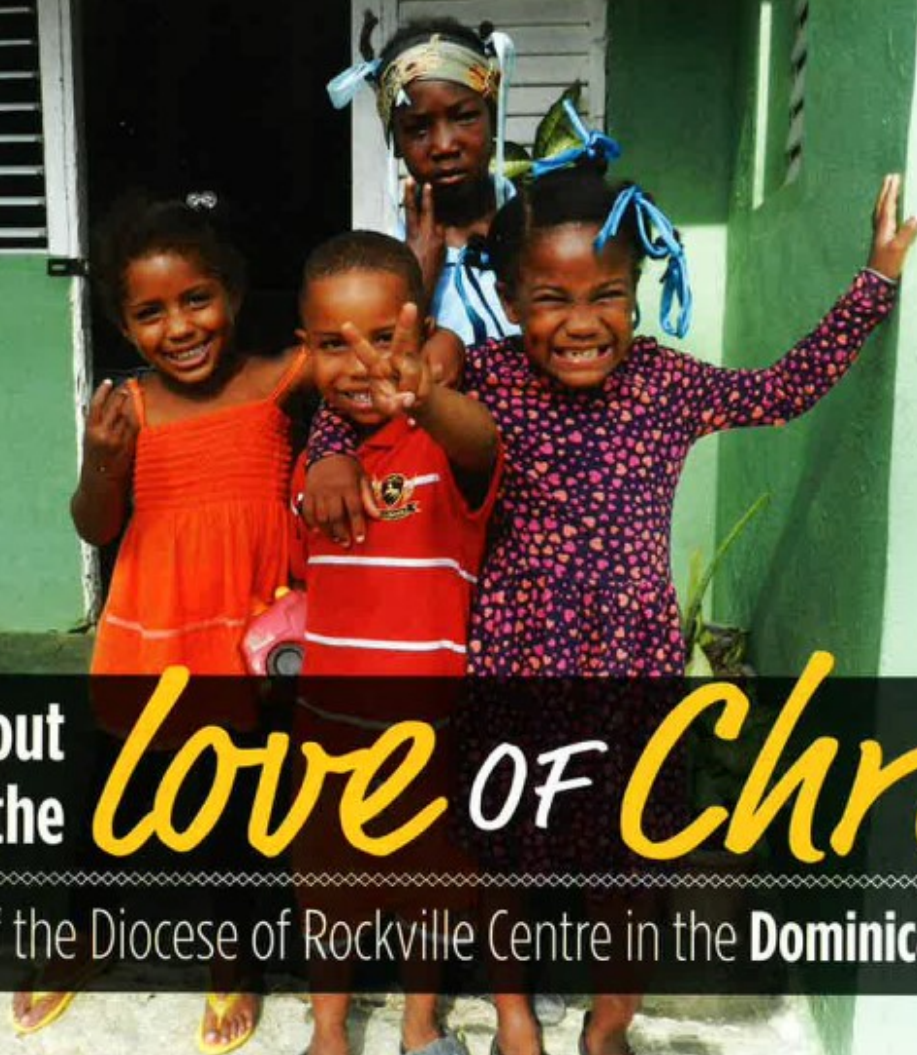

Wherever you live in the Parish, there are poor families living within walking distance of your home. When in need, they ring the rectory bell. They are, in effect, ringing your doorbell. The assistance provided by our Parish conference goes directly to individuals and families in Deer Park and North Babylon. In the past three months, we have helped four individuals/families to pay their rent and mortgage arrears; we have helped four individuals/families to pay their car insurance bills to avoid termination and to allow our neighbors to continue to drive to work and to doctor visits; we have helped a family pay storage charges; we have paid for repairs to the heating system of a senior citizen; and we have provided clothing to several residents of a local group home. We have also assisted two individuals/families pay uninsured medical expenses and have helped a neighbor obtain health insurance so that he could have needed surgery. This Lenten season is the perfect time for you to consider doing good in our community by becoming a Vincentian. In person meetings will be resuming in the next few weeks (see the upcoming bulletins for details), and all are welcome to join our meetings to see what we are all about.

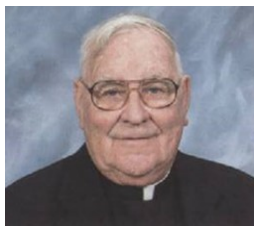

As I was reading Fr. Gius' letter from the Pastor last week I sat here nodding my head. As I have said many times everyone has a God given talent. Perhaps you aren't even aware of what yours is. You know it doesn't have to be something big for it to be important. Sometimes we don't think that what we have to share is worthwhile. I assure you whatever you are "good" at can be meaningful to the parish. I can say without a doubt that at sometime in your life someone has said gosh you are so good at that!

I know it seems I am complaining about things. However, I wish you would take it as explaining rather than complaining. We are grateful for the donations as always. It is more beneficial for the items to be donated that are needed at the time the bulletin is published. It is hard to store things that we have an abundance of and have shelves almost empty of what we actually need.
