The **Synod of Bishops** will meet in October 2023 to explore the theme of synodality – journeying together– in the life of the Church. Though less than two years away from gathering in Rome, preparations for this XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops – For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and, Mission – have begun.

During this preparatory phase, Pope Francis desires the involvement of the People



of God. He wants the Church to journey together: walking forward, listening to the Holy Spirit and the Word of God. To this end, the Holy Father has asked every diocese to have an experience of synodality before they meet.

March 27, 2022

Bishop Andrzej Zglejszewski has been asked by Bishop John Barres to lead our

diocesan synodal process. With his characteristic joy, enthusiasm. and collaborative spirit, he will ensure our journeying together is fruitful and graceful. In the coming days, he will communicate how the experience of synodality can be lived in the Diocese. especially in our parishes.

Bishop Andrzej will give two opportunities as he gives a Liturgical Catechesis on the meaning of Synod of Syndolity, explaining the three themes







As I was reading Fr. Gius' letter from the Pastor a couple of weeks ago I sat here nodding my head. As I have said many times everyone has a God given talent. Perhaps you aren't even aware of what yours is. You know it doesn't have to be something big for it to be important. Sometimes we don't think that what we must share is worthwhile. I assure you whatever you are "good" at can be meaningful to the parish. I can say without a doubt that at sometime in your life someone has said gosh you are so good at that! So I have not really heard from you! It is Lent so perhaps this can be part of your Lenten journey.

So let someone know what it is that you are good at, and we will figure it out together.

Again, I feel like I am always saying something people don't necessarily want to hear. So, I apologize for reiterating once again. Please do not donate past dated items. Please do not clean out your pantry or that of someone else and donate items that you would not use yourself. Please do not donate items with no nutritional information on the package. This is usually because the information was on the box the items came in and they are not for individual sale. We cannot give out food without the nutritional information. Please do not donate items meant for big families. We have very few of them. Most of our clients are one or two people. Also, please stop putting garbage in the bins meant to collect the food. It is very disrespectful to the people who empty the bins and put the food away.

I know it seems I am complaining about things. However, I wish you would take it as explaining rather than complaining. We are grateful for the donations as always. It is more beneficial for the items to be donated that are needed at the time the bulletin is published. It is hard to store things that we have an abundance of and have shelves almost empty of what we actually need.

God Bless all of you for your generosity.

We have been receiving refrigerated items in the bins. Please do not do this. We received ground beef and a whole chicken in the bin. They leaked on the other food. By the time we are able to empty the bins on Monday morning any refrigerated items have to be thrown out. Please call me to make arrangements for these items to be donated. This is very important.

Word on Fire with Father Grace

Resumes this Tuesday March 29th at 7:15 p.m. in the Father Behan Hall

Word on Fire is a Catholic media organization founded by Bishop Robert Barron that uses digital and traditional media to introduce Catholicism to the broader world.
