#### The Rite of Election

The conclusion of the Period of the Catechumenate in the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) leads into the Rite of Election or Enrollment of Names for those who are unbaptized (and the Rite of Calling the Candidates to Continuing Conversion for those who are baptized). This year, for our parish, we have two Catechumens, Eric Wiener and Ali Wiener, whose names will be recorded in the Book of the Elect. This is a very significant step in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is usually celebrated on the first Sunday of Lent at the local diocesan cathedral, led by the local bishop. This year, because of pandemic restrictions, the diocese has delegated the pastor or his representative to celebrate this Rite in our own home parish.

The two Catechumens and their Godparents and Sponsors gather together on this day and join the parish congregation. The Church formally ratifies the Catechumens' readiness for the Sacraments of Initiation. In turn the Catechumens – from now on known as the Elect – publicly acknowledge their desire to receive the Sacraments of Initiation.

## Weekly Greeting from Ms. Laucella

We have officially entered a new Liturgical Season; Lent. These next forty days, we remember Jesus fasting and praying in the desert before He began His public ministry. During these forty days, He was hungry, He was tired, He was tempted, and He was alone; Not an easy position to be in, even for the Son of Man.

Like Advent, Lent is a time of waiting and preparing. Both Advent and Lent ultimately get ready for New Life. However, the preparing of Lent is very different from the waiting of Advent, because this Season of waiting has something looming over us the closer we get to the end; Death. The Death of Our Savior is scary, and overwhelming, and sorrowful, and sometimes something that we can't even wrap our heads around. However, this Death of Jesus is <u>one that was fully chosen freely</u>. That choice is ultimately what gives us the New Life that we crave for. Just as the Adam of the Old Testament chose a life-giving-fruit that would ultimately bring death to humankind, Jesus, the New Adam of the New Testament, drank the cup of death that God the Father gave Him on our behalf, which would lead to New Life for humanity forever, should we so choose it.

We have officially entered the desert. Lent is difficult, and throughout this journey, we also may find ourselves hungry, tired, and tempted, but we have something that Jesus did not have; Someone who went before us. *Jesus spent forty days in the desert alone, so that we would never have to*. I wish all of you and your families and loved ones a prayerful and sacred Lenten season. May all of our time in the desert lead us to the New Life that we hunger and thirst for so dearly and desperately.
