Weekly Greeting from Ms. Laucella

Happy Easter Octave! These first eight days of Easter are filled with so many beautiful Gospel passages, all with the same theme; Encounter. From the three women witnessing an angel at the empty tomb, to Mary Magdalene being the first to see the Risen Christ, to Jesus walking with two of His disciples on the road to Emmaus, to Him showing His apostles His Wounds, the encounters that fill this time period after the Resurrection are ones of not only great joy, but also of great trust. For the ones who mourned Jesus after His Death, this time must have been so overwhelming for them after so many conflicting emotions in the short span of a week; The excitement of Palm Sunday, the confusion of feet being washed after being told that their bread was now flesh, the devastation of Good Friday, the silence of Holy Saturday, and the joy of that first Easter morning. Throughout it all, Jesus' Mother, friends, and followers all had the strength to trust, even when the final outcome seemed far from sight.



The Easter Octave concludes with Divine Mercy Sunday, a Feast day that is so beautifully tied to Saint Faustina. She had visions of Jesus, and wrote about her encounters with Him in her diary. In these moments with Faustina, Jesus conveyed to her His great mercy for humankind, and all who seek it. The Image of Christ in these visions has been venerated over the last century, and the inscription that Christ requested under the Image, "Jesus, I trust in You!" has become a mantra to so many. May this last day of the Easter Octave be one that is filled with joy, and a day that reminds of how deeply Christ wants us to seek encounter with Him; All we have to do is trust in His Mercy and His great Love for us.




