out palms as people enter the Church at the beginning of each Mass. We are encouraging everyone to take ONLY one palm per person. We wish to make sure people attending the later Masses will have palms as well. Note: We will not be giving palms at the end of Mass nor in between Masses. Remember part of the significance of these palms is that they have been blessed as people hold them at the entrance procession of each Mass.

The **Diocesan Day of Penance** will take place as usual on Monday of Holy Week. Every parish in the Diocese will provide the Sacrament of Reconciliation to the faithful continuously from 2:00 to 4:00 pm and from 6:00 to 9:00 pm.

The **Holy Thursday** Mass of the Lord's Supper Liturgy at 8:00 pm is a remembrance of the Last Supper. The Rite of Washing of the Feet returns this year. After the Mass, the Most Blessed Sacrament will be processed and trans-*...continued on page 4*



ferred to the Gym for the vigil until 11:00pm.

For **Good Friday**, On Good Friday, we have brought back our old tradition of Outdoor Stations of the Cross on Deer Park Avenue at 12:00 noon.

In addition, there are two Liturgies of the Word, at 3:00 and 7:00 pm, that include the Veneration of the Cross. The cross will be unveiled but individual veneration of the cross is still suspended this year. Instead, the ushers will be handing out nails as people leave the Church. This is a symbol of the event of the crucifixion of Jesus on the cross that we carry and bring home. There is a higher level of meaning, as we ask you to come back and attend any of the Easter Sunday Masses and ask you to drop your nails back in assigned baskets in the Church. As you give up the cross on Easter Sunday, be reminded that Jesus has been removed and freed from being nailed to the cross and has been raised from the dead. It is a reminder also of our resolve to

give up our sinful ways. Please do not place the nails on the cross in the Sanctuary.

The **Easter Vigil** (Saturday at 8pm) will include the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation for our two Elects, who have prepared themselves through the RCIA Program. The vigil will include the blessing of the paschal candle and the baptismal font.

Masses on **Easter Sunday** are 8:00 am, 9:30 am, 11:00 am and 12:30 pm. There is no 6:00 pm Mass. All Masses are in the Church. There is another simultaneous Mass in the Gym at 11:00 am.

We encourage you to attend all of the liturgies, which includes the **Morning Prayer** on **Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday at 8:30 am**. For those who are unable to be in Church, we made sure that most of the liturgies are available at home on livestream on Facebook and YouTube.



Director of Parish Social Ministry

Just when we thought it was spring...... I suppose one of these days we will wake up to spring or summer insert a smile on my face here!

As we move along, and things look like they are getting back to a life we somewhat remember I would like to ask people who like to grocery shop to help the pantry by going to the grocery store for needed items. I have the gift cards if you have the time.

Right now we need gift cards for gas so that our clients that are able to work can get to work. Most of them have very low paying jobs so you can imagine that paying for gas is a great drain on their resources.

I am also in need of foldable grocery carts for our people who walk to the pantry. Some walk two or three miles to get here. As you can imagine that means they cannot carry very much with them on the way back home.
