



Director of Parish Social Ministry

Hello everyone. I hope you are having a good week.

I have a couple of things to share:

- 1. What the heck is this survey and why do you want us to fill it out? First let me just say it's important. Pope Francis wants to know from us, and that means all of us, not a select few what the Church is doing right and what we have not gotten right. How we are or are not meeting the needs of the people. If we want the church to grow again we have to evolve we cannot get stuck in what was. I am not saying change everything I am saying we need to figure out what our people need to come back home to us. When I say we I mean all of us, the staff, the people in the pews and all that we encounter.
- 2. The synod on Synodality is listening to the Holy Spirit and the prayerful discernment of Pope Francis as he reads what is happening today. He states "It is precisely the path of snodality which God expects of the Church in the third millennium"
- 3. What the Synod is not is as important as what it is. This is not about changing church teaching. It is not about the Bishops of the Church getting together to discuss their thoughts.
- 4. The Synod is a mission for each and everyone of us to pray and hear what the Holy Spirit is asking us to do to bring the Church in the future. This is our mission and our responsibility.
- 5. If you fill out the survey please understand your answers do not make Ss Cyril and Methodius look bad to the Bishop or Pope. I am asking you to be thoughtful in your answers for it affects not just the Synod. I will be using them also to see what is needed here in this parish in the here and now.
- 6. When the surveys are checked with all agree or all disagree that does not give us a very accurate picture.
