Dear Parishioners,

Congratulations to our boys and girls who were confirmed on Friday, May 27, 2022. You all worked hard for this. May you be inspired to exercise the gifts of the Holy Spirit given to you on the day of your Confirmation.

As we look out at the trees and flowers brought by springtime, there is a newness of creation everywhere. Today there is a newness, completion to the Liturgical year as we celebrate **PENTECOST**, the coming of the Holy Spirit. There are so many ways to meditate

on this special feast – from consideration of the meaning of the name itself to the way the apostles approached this feast. Perhaps we could start with the words of the Sequence:

Come, Holy Spirit, come!
And from your celestial home
Shed a ray of light divine!

It was in that upper room that Jesus appeared to His apostles on Easter and today it is the Holy Spirit that rests on each person as an invisible tongue of fire, giving each one that special gift to speak – live. On this special day let each one of us be quiet, open to the Spirit at this time as with the apostles when “suddenly there comes a noise like a strong driving wind, that fills the entire house. Then appear tongues of fire that come to rest on each one so that they are filled with the Holy Spirit.”

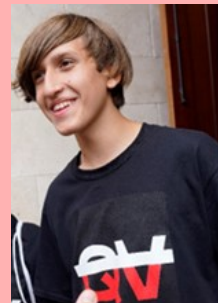


As Catholics, we all hold dear the responsibility of bringing our young people into our family of faith and guiding them on a lifelong journey with Christ.
