What word comes to your mind when you think of summer?

High on the list is probably “heat” and whether that is good or bad depends on where you come down on the thermostat wars. If you are like Bishop Anthony B. Taylor, then the warmer the better.

Vacation is when we hope our thoughts will be less occupied with what causes stress, and more focused on what we treasure most.

Another word high on most lists is “vacation.” For those who live by school schedules, summer means time off and chances to get away somewhere. We look forward to things slowing down a bit.

The word itself has the Latin root, “vacare,” which means to be unoccupied. That can have the literal meaning such as when we vacate a building, but there is the deeper meaning that allows vacation to be a time of

renewal. Vacation is when we hope our thoughts will be less occupied with what causes stress, and more focused on what we treasure most.

It is crucial for renewal to take stock of what is most important, to slow down and look around and to soak in the love of family and friends. Of course, God understands this basic need that we have. When God commands a day of rest every week he has our good in mind. Sabbath is a word that means rest and reveals that God wants us to have a vacation every week.

The best vacations allow some time for reflection and an exercise in gratitude. St. Matthew tells us that where our treasure is we will find our heart. How about a little homework for the summer? A mental exercise can help us take better advantage of our vacation.

Make some time to sit with your thoughts. Pay attention to where your mind goes when it is

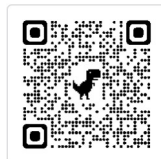
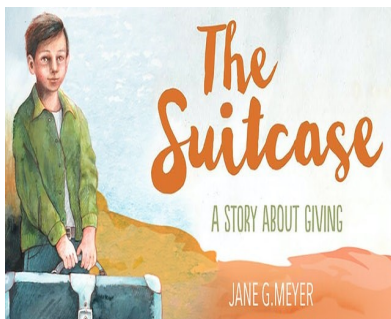
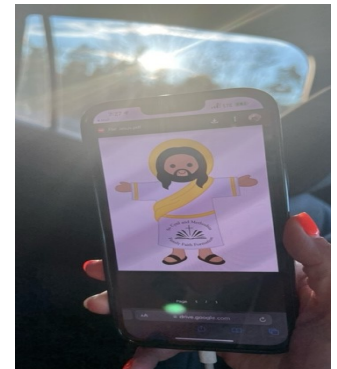
Registration for 2022-2023

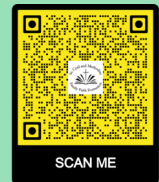

For these families, please remember that **Registration will only be processed if all 10 Mass Reports from the 2021-2022 Year have been handed in and completed.** These families can access their particular Registration Form via this QR Code.



New, First-Time Students and/or Families:

New families are families with students who have never been enrolled in any Faith Formation Program before. These new families require a copy of the child's Baptismal Certificate and other Sacrament Information in order for our Office to process Registration for their child. If you are one of these families and would like to be put on our potential incoming students email chain, please email us. These families can access their particular Registration Form via this QR Code.

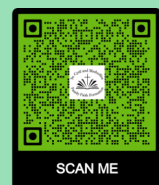


Transfer Students and/or Families:

Transfer families are families that were not enrolled in our 2021-2022 Program, but have been enrolled in another Parish's Faith Formation Program before. These families can be:

- Families transferring from a Parish they received Faith Formation during 2021-2022

To be placed in the appropriate, corresponding program, these families require a copy of the child's Baptismal Certificate, and a transfer letter from your previous Faith Formation Program with what Levels the child completed, and the Sacraments that they received. Certain Levels or days may fill up quicker, depending on the space available to us.
