Dear parishioners,

Hello and I hope you are having a blessed day. I was very pleased and humbled when Father Gius asked me to write this week's bulletin letter.

During the last month of July, there truly seemed to be a recurring message in all of the Sunday gospel readings that were meant to inspire us and our understanding of the responsibility that each of us shares in the role of social ministry, whether it was referring to the 72 who relied on the generosity of others or the Good Samaritan who served the needs of the victim along the road. We heard that we need to love our neighbor as ourselves and if our neighbor calls upon us, we need to respond. These are examples Christ taught us about His outreach as He went to those who were on the fringe of society and He ministered to those who were forgotten or ignored.

His motivation was simply love.

The question that usually arises when deciding about this calling is what can I do? Thankfully, the hardest part is over because the decision to do something has been made and you are ready to answer the call and thankfully there are many ways to get involved, but at Ss. Cyril and Methodius each week, our bulletin has a list of things that our food pantry is in low supply of. People from "Our" community relies on your generosity as they are trying to feed their families. Take the time to look at that list and drop some things in one of the pails near the entrances of the church and make it an ongoing effort.

Another way of answering the call is by coming down to one of the St. Vincent de Paul meetings, which typically happens on the first Wednesday and third Monday of each month in the Senior room near the gym. The meetings

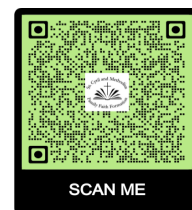
Registration for 2022-2023

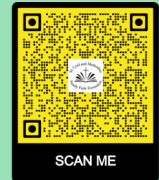

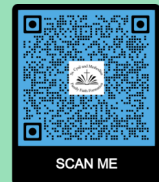
Current, Active Families:

For these families, please remember that **Registration will only be processed if all 10 Mass Reports from the 2021-2022 Year have been handed in and completed.** These families can access their particular Registration Form via this QR Code.



New, First-Time Students and/or Families:

New families are families with students who have never been enrolled in any Faith Formation Program before. These new families require a copy of the child's Baptismal Certificate and other Sacrament Information in order for our Office to process Registration for their child. If you are one of these families and would like to be put on our potential incoming students email chain, please email us. These families can access their particular Registration Form via this QR Code.

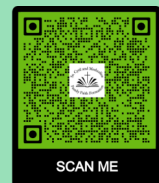


Transfer Students and/or Families:

Transfer families are families that were not enrolled in our 2021-2022 Program, but have been enrolled in another Parish's Faith Formation Program before. These families can be:

- Families transferring from a Parish they received Faith Formation during 2021-2022
- Families who have been enrolled with us in the past, but were not enrolled with us for the 2021-2022 Year

To be placed in the appropriate, corresponding program, these families require a copy of the child's Baptismal Certificate, and a transfer letter from your previous Faith Formation Program with what Levels the child completed, and the Sacraments that they received. Certain Levels or days may fill up quicker, depending on the space available to us. For this reason, **those who mail back their Registration Forms to us sooner will be given first priority for the availability of having an in-person session.** Please know that we will do our best to work with everyone as best as we can, based on what we have available.

Director of Parish Social Ministry

Well, this week I am going to address the elephant in the room. That is if you are not part of the solution you are part of the problem. I have gotten a great deal of positive feedback from last weeks letter. To be sure I have heard grumblings. Of course, none of them called me or spoke to me face to face, which I encourage every single week in the bulletin. No, instead people speak among themselves behind the proverbial back. This is disingenuous. You may not even know that I was around and heard you. Honestly, you can just come to me and discuss.

The thing about reading something is that you have no way of knowing what the tone is of the item being read. Many assumptions can be made that may not be reality. I did receive a disturbing email accusing me of being angry because "my ideas" did not bring forth enough volunteers. One, I am not angry, two they were not my ideas, but ideas brought to me. Telling me that you have gone to Mass every week of your life means what exactly? This is what we are called to do. Veiled references to monetary support of the parish, taken as "I pay your salary" mentality is hurtful. Saying you make weekly donations to the food pantry that is something else we are called to do, take care of the poor.

Absolutely no concrete suggestions were made as to how to build community. Neither did this person volunteer. I am saying please talk to me. Don't send angry emails if there is something you disagree with. I am not going to respond to emails of this kind because it can never be resolved through that kind of dialog. This is not "constructive" criticism it is just criticism. The point that I am "preaching to the choir" means you missed the entire point. Whatever you read in the bulletin either by me, the pastor or anyone else is meant to be taken from the bulletin and brought out to the greater community to let them know we are here and would love to have them join us. Spreading the "Good News"

Cliques was the only thing from the letter that was addressed face to face. Some people have come to me face to face about the clique comment. That I appreciate. None of these people objected to anything else written although of course the opportunity was there. We had a chance to talk about it. My point is that cliques do exist. They are by and large not even intentional. Many people don't realize that they are being viewed as cliques and therefore people don't feel welcomed. Usually this comes about because the "cliques" have been relying on a small group to get things done. When someone new comes in we must make a concerted effort to welcome them. Listen I am not saying it is easy all I am saying is try to be more aware. It isn't that people are being turned away with an attitude of we don't need or want you, we do not do that. Instead, if they don't feel very welcomed and a "we are so glad you could join us" doesn't happen they may feel unsure if they should be there. All of this is being said so that all of us should be aware of how our different ministries are being viewed by others. Getting the job done is important. So, to those who would like to become a part of something go volunteer. I promise they really do want you to be a part of their community within a community.

To all the people who do so much for the Parish I do thank you and I have said many times that Ss Cyril and Methodius is a very generous parish. There are many many volunteers here who do things that you may not even realize are being done. Everyone has busy lives, I know that. However, when we want to we always make time for the things we want to do. Sometimes we must look at things we may feel uncomfortable doing, or really don't want to do as making a sacrifice for our Lord. When we put things in context of serving the Lord things become easier to do and hearts become lighter.

Please take this letter in the spirit it was written with great love for our Lord and for the people here. Again, I say I am approachable, and my door is always open to one and all.

We recently had the pleasure to meet with Councilman Martinez to discuss our concerns and explore options available through the Town of Babylon.
