September 25, 2022

When a loved one passes, consider giving a beautiful memorial chasuble or vestment in lieu of flowers. This is a more lasting way to preserve the memory of the deceased and have their legacy live on for years to come. The family or friends of the deceased donate the gift to the church, where it will be used in appropriate liturgical celebrations or passed on to another church in need. Either way, the thoughtful gift will be used and cherished, honoring the memory of the deceased every time it is used. Memorialized vestments will bear the name of the deceased embroidered on a piece of cloth and attached inside the vestments using customized labels.

We currently have two vestment sets that are available for memorialization.

One of the vestments is a set we use exclusively for Funeral Masses. It is an ele-

We have also purchased a set of matching vestments for Concelebrated Liturgical Gatherings such as Christmas and Easter. These vestments include a Presider's Chasuble, 5 Concelebrant Chasubles and 2 Dalmatics for our deacons. They were made by the PDDM sisters of Boston Massachusetts. You may choose to memorialize them as a set (8 vestments in total) or as individual pieces.

The federal government, the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) are proposing rule (RIN 0945-AA17), which expands the definition of "sex discrimination" to include "termination of pregnancy" and "gender identity".

If HHS adopts this, it could be construed to require healthcare professionals and providers to perform abortions and also require a health plan to cover abortions, based on the theory that declining to do so would constitute sex discrimination.

The rule would similarly prohibit health professionals and other health care providers from declining to provide abortions and prohibit health plans from declining to cover gender-transition procedures, again on the theory that a decision not to participate or pay for such procedures constitutes sex discrimination.

I urge you to contact HHS to comment on the proposed rule. Comments must be received by HHS on or before October 3, 2022. Address it to: U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office for Civil Rights.

"The proposal rule (RIN-AA17) is an affront to, and offends, the conscience rights of health care professionals and entities that seek to Do No Harm and to offer practical and life-giving care to the people they serve.

Health care providers and insurers should not be coerced to perform or cover abortions or transgender procedures.

A decision not to provide or cover abortion or transgender procedures is not sex discrimination.

Provisions of the proposed rule that can be construed to require the providing for, or coverage of, such procedures violate rights of conscience and religious freedom as reflected in current federal conscience laws, including the Weldon Amendment.

For these reasons, I oppose the abortion and gender identity provisions of the proposed rule."

September 27 is the feast day of St. Vincent de Paul. St. Vincent de Paul devoted himself entirely to the alleviation of the suffering of the poor. To that end he established the Confraternities of Charity, later know as the Ladies of Charity, in 1617. In 1625, he founded the Congregation of the Mission, his community of priests and brothers. With St. Louise de Marillac, he cofounded the daughters of Charity in 1633. St. Vincent de Paul died in Paris on September 27, 1660. He was canonized in 1737 and Pope Leo XIII declared him the patron saint of all works of charity. Today, some 400 years after his lifetime, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul continues his mission to provide support and assistance to our neighbors in need.

A native of Floyd, Virginia, he began formal piano lessons at age six and was playing for Sunday services in his home parish by age 12. He began teaching himself to play the organ at age 13 and held his first position as church organist at age 15.

Mr. Bower received his Bachelor's Degree Magna Cum Laude in Sacred Music and Organ Performance from Westminster Choir College, Princeton, where he studied organ with the late Dr. Donald G. During his undergraduate years, Mr. Bower pursued additional organ study with Marilyn Keiser of Indiana University and Gerre Hancock, St. Thomas Church, Fifth Avenue, New York. He continued organ study with Stephen Cleobury at Kings College, Cambridge, and conducting with John Rutter at Clare College, Cambridge, England.

Michael earned his Master's Degree with Honors in Organ Performance from Manhattan School of Music, where he studied organ with John Walker, Baroque continuo with Kenneth Cooper, and conducting with Amy Keiser. At graduation, Bower received the John Cerovalo award for his outstanding performance of the music of Johann Sebastian Bach. Bower has performed organ recitals on the East Coast, the Mid-West, Germany, Austria, Italy, France, and England.

Michael was the Dean of the Nassau County Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, Chair of the International Conference of Roman Catholic Cathedral Musicians, and past member of the Diocesan Liturgy Commission of Rockville Centre.





We have a number of clients who have had to give up their cars because they can no longer afford them. We can use grocery carts for the walkers. As always anything you can do to help is greatly appreciated.

Gift cards are always welcome. Gift cards from anywhere are of course most welcome. I say Aldi and Lidl mostly because the dollar goes much further there. Even Dollar Tree has many things we can purchase. That is not to say we don't want gift cards to the other stores as well. We also want to support our local grocery stores as well.

Many people who were not able to get assistance paying for child care in the past are now eligible and may not know it. This applies not only to the clients in the outreach, but many of our parishioners who may not be aware of this program as they are not receiving other services. This child care subsidy can help pay for before and after school programs and even to pay family members in some cases (they must be registered as providers). With money being very tight these days for most families.

New income guidelines for child care assistance:

Starting August 1 2022, households with incomes up to 300% of the State Income Standard are eligible for the child care subsidy program. For example, a family of 2 with a household income of \$54,930 or a family of 4 with a household income up to \$83,250 can apply for child care assistance. Applications can be submitted through the local Nassau or Suffolk Department of Social Services or by mail.
