All Saints' Day

Every year the Church recalls the example, witness, and prayer of the holy women and men who have been identified by the Church as Saints. These saints are more than just role models; they are family members with whom we continue to share relation, in a bond of praver. called the Communion of Saints. Every year when we celebrate this day, the Gospel we proclaim recalls for us Jesus' teaching about happiness, the Beatitudes. We quickly note in this reading that none of those Jesus names as "blessed" or "happy" are expected . . . the poor in spirit, the meek, the persecuted. Jesus' blueprint for happiness reflects little of what the world might call happiness.


Diocesan Catechetical Awards



Dear Friends:

As we enter the cool months of the fall and come nearer to the close of our liturgical year, I pray that you and your loved ones are well and that you have a blessed end of the year. I would like to thank you and your fellow parishioners for the prayers and support that have been offered on behalf of our parish. Although the pandemic is mostly behind us, difficult world events today are once again making it difficult for so many in our community, so your prayers and support are still much needed!

When we come together as a parish, we can provide many ministries and services that one person cannot do alone. This holds true for our diocese as well; when our Parishes come together as *One Family in Mission*, we can evangelize and serve more than 600,000 people every year. If you have not yet participated in the 2022 Catholic Ministries Appeal, I ask for your support. Your donation builds a community of faith, hope and love on Long Island. We build a community of faith as we educate our seminarians and provide faith formation to our young people and lay leaders. The spike in gas and food prices combined with the high cost of housing has caused a shift of people who are turning to their local parish outreach for assistance. "*There was an increase of those living "paycheck to paycheck" even before the high inflation, but now their income just doesn't go as far, so they are coming to the PSM Pantry/Outreach for the first time.*" shared Paula Malloy, Director of PSM, Catholic Charities of Long Island. Additionally, she mentioned, "*There are many families working in our community, who do not qualify for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits, and they are struggling to feed their families. They are also new clients of our parish outreach programs.*"

If you are not able to give this year because of hardships you are facing and you need support, please know that we have resources to help you. 
Make a Joyful Noise! FUTURE EVENTS
