This will be an evolving mission, and we will learn as we grow, where it will take us!



Parish Social Ministry

This week I would like to highlight one of our very best volunteers at Parish Social Ministry - Patrick Donahue. Many of you already know the Donahue family and may even know Patrick or have seen him at Mass. He is tall, good looking and always wears headphones. Patrick faithfully comes to Outreach every Thursday and even has his name posted on our 'sign-in-and-out' board. Patrick is a strong and very willing young man. When he comes in he can choose which of several jobs to work on. He will put up or bring down packaged items from the top shelves for us. He checks our inventory of canned goods and if an item is low on the distribution shelves and there is more in stock on the top shelf, he takes it down and replenishes it.

He has been helping with sorting out all the donations people have brought for the thrift store. ***(I must mention we didn't ask for any of these donations .Some one is filling the food bin with used clothing) Unfortunately all the things left outside the door and things put in the bins that are not for the pantry have to be discarded.***. There are many things we are not able to sell, and Patrick has been working diligently to try to sort it all out and cart them to the dumpster. I am sure this is not your intent.

Patrick does not come alone. He comes with his support staff: a wonderful young woman named Kristen (or Kristie or Kiki - she is open to however anyone wishes to address her.) Thanks to her, Patrick is learning important life skills here.

As I have come to know Kristen, I have learned that she works with a number of young people with various needs. As you may or may not know, the Parish Social Ministry Center has many areas upstairs which are vacant and not currently being used. On the second floor is a kitchen which is now being utilized on Mondays while I am here - Kristen brings three young men and one of their mothers is teaching them how to cook. They are learning practical life skills just as Patrick does on Thursdays.

As of now, access to the top 2 floors of the Social Ministry building is limited to staircases. I am hoping to raise enough money for the installation of an elevator so that in the near future this building can be utilized to its fullest potential. I have so many hopes and dreams for turning it into a place of knowledge, comfort and joy for our communities. I say "communities" because we are, after all, one large community with many smaller communities within it.

I thought you might want to learn about the things that happen around here that you may not be aware of. We are not just the food pantry. Of course, the food pantry is extremely important but Parish Social Ministry is so much more than that.
