

FROM THE PASTOR

We thank Robert and Linda Laucella for setting up the **presepio** at the Children's chapel. In order to preserve it, the metal gates of the chapel are locked. But you are more than welcome to view it anytime during the day and take pictures.

The **presepio**, from the Latin "presepium" - (*manger*) has been the symbol of Christmas for Italian families for dozens of generations, and in the South, perhaps as long as a thousand years. It is a tradition of devotion representing the birth of the baby Jesus. These nativity scenes typically consist of a structure to represent the simple barn where Joseph and Mary were forced to give birth to the Son of God. An ox, donkey, angels and perhaps the three Wise Men are typically represented.

But the presepio is much, much more, show-



ing village scenes from every day life. Its components are mostly handmade from a variety of materials: wood, ceramic, cartapesta (Papier-mâché), terracotta and fabrics. Some scenes include small waterfalls or fountains, houses, buildings, mountains, trees, grottoes, livestock and vendors of all sorts. The details can be absolutely astounding. In the coming years, we hope to be expanding the parish collection to preserve the tradition.




CHURCH CLEANING MINISTRY

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DONATIONS (QCD)

Direct transfers from IRAs to Charities – a tax benefit for you

This unique opportunity allows taxpayers to make charitable contributions through a direct IRA transfer.

If you would like to make a gift using your Ira and if:

- 1. You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift
- 2. Your IRA is a traditional (some Roth IRA's may qualify)
- 3. You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

TAX SAVING ADVANTAGES:

- 1. QCDs are not included in your adjusted gross income.
- 2. QCDs deliver a tax benefit while "regular" charitable donations might not since the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act almost doubled the standard deductions amounts.
- 3. QCDs taken from your traditional IRA counts as a distribution for the required minimum distribution (RMD) rules. Therefore, you can donate all or part of your RMD that you would otherwise be forced to receive and pay taxes on.

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution." In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift <u>must</u> go directly from your IRA to the Charity. If you receive the money first then you'll be taxed on it like any other distribution.

Bill has a \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 to his parish. Upon hearing of the **Charitable IRA Rollover** opportunity, he directs the custodian of his IRA to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2022 directly to the Parish as the family's 2022 gift. He gets to exclude the IRA distribution given to charity from income.



Dear Altar Servers, you are, in fact, already apostles of Jesus! When you take part in the Liturgy by carrying out your altar service, you offer a witness to all. Your absorption, the devotion that wells up from your heart and is expressed in gestures, in song, in the responses: if you do it correctly and not absent-mindedly, then in a certain way your witness is one that moves people. The Eucharist is the source and summit of the bond of friend-ship with Jesus. You are very close to Jesus in the Eucharist, and this is the most important sign of his friend-ship for each one of us. Do not forget it.
