My dear parishioners,

This letter has been mailed to all parishioners in the parish registry.








Please join us for an **ADVENT TRIPTYCH** three nights of ADVENT PRAYER AND REFLECTION

Guide us as we strive to make our parish communities places of welcome and assistance for mothers in need. Help us become instruments of God's love and compassion.


