Divine Mercy Sunday

From the diary of Mother Faustina in her conversation with Jesus, we read: "The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. ... These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross" (Diary, 299). In other words, these two rays signify the sacraments of mercy (Baptism and Penance), and the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the blood of souls, carrying life-sustaining food for our spiritual journey. The water is analogous to the sacraments of Baptism and Penance, in that through these sacraments our souls are washed clean.

Weekly Greeting from Ms. Laucella

Happy Easter Octave! These first eight days of Easter are filled with so many beautiful Gospel passages, all with the same theme; Encounter. From the three women witnessing an angel at the empty tomb, to Mary Magdalene being the first to see the Risen Christ, to Jesus walking with two of His disciples on the road to Emmaus, to Him showing His apostles His Wounds, the encounters that fill this time period after the Resurrection are ones of not only great joy, but also of great trust. For the ones who mourned Jesus after His Death, this time must have been so overwhelming for them after so many conflicting emotions in the short span of a week; The excitement of Palm Sunday, the confusion of feet being washed after being told that their bread was now flesh, the devastation of Good Friday, the silence of Holy Saturday, and the joy of that first Easter morning. Throughout it all, Jesus' Mother, friends, and followers all had the strength to trust, even when the final outcome seemed far from sight.

The Easter Octave concludes with Divine Mercy Sunday, a Feast day that is so beautifully tied to Saint Faustina. She had visions of Jesus, and wrote about her encounters with Him in her diary. In these moments with Faustina, Jesus conveyed to her His great mercy for humankind, and all who seek it. The Image of Christ in these visions has been venerated over the last century, and the inscription that Christ requested under the Image, "Jesus, I trust in You!" has become a mantra to so many. In a specific way, for me this year, knowing and seeing how much God continues to provide no matter the circumstance has been an incredible source of strength, encouragement, and security. Giving that trust over can be difficult, but is an incredibly freeing feeling when we hand over whatever burdens or whatever is weighing heavy on our hearts to Jesus. May this last day of the Easter Octave be one that is filled with joy, and a day that reminds of how deeply Christ wants us to seek encounter with Him; All we have to do is trust in His Mercy and His great Love for us.




LITURGY CORNER

WHY HAS THE CANTOR BEGUN TO SING AN ANTIPHON BEFORE THE COMMUNION HYMN?

The antiphons in the Roman Missal and Graduale Romanum are the texts given to us by the Church for each particular liturgy, so there really are no other texts more ideal to sing than the antiphons! Yes, we should still sing a hymn that will unite our hearts to Christ and one another, but if we add the antiphons, we have the opportunity to pray these special scripture verses from the Missal. When the cantor chants the antiphons, we can begin to see the rhythm of the liturgical year in a new way. We can start to identify certain texts with certain liturgies, which enriches our liturgies, as well as, our personal devotion to sacred scripture.
