



CELL PHONES IN CHURCH

Those of us on the ministerial staff, who attend multiple Masses each week, can tell you that at least one cell phone goes off at **EVERY** single Mass!


We all know that our cantors always remind us to silence our phones before Mass begins. Unfortunately, this has not been very effective.
