Dear parishioners,

Again, I want to encourage support from everyone by buying your tickets now to watch the concert of the Philippine Madrigal Singers on Saturday, May 20, 2023 at 7:00 pm in the Church. This is a unique opportunity for us to witness world class talent. This is a special event, one night only and is very hard to come by, and we are fortunate to be the only venue in Long Island where they will be performing. They have performed in the past in my previous assignments in St Frances in Wantagh and Our Lady of Grace in West Babylon. Ticket sales will go to help us with the refurbishing project of the pews of the Church.

The best way I describe them is that "they sit together and sing (acapella)" - no theatrics, no gimmicks, just pure and amazing singing!

The group's virtuosity across a vast repertoire range, its continuing promotion of Filipino choral works and the rousing and deeply emotional impact that each performance has on all audiences the world over, as they sing in the distinctive set-up of sitting in a semi-circle without a conductor, have established their reputation as a pioneering force in choral music and an inspirational role model for other choirs.

The **Madz**, as they are fondly called, is also the country's most active ambassadors of goodwill. They have sung for many of the world's most influential and prominent leaders in state visits and command performances. Among them were Pope Francis, Pope Paul VI, Pope John Paul II, Pope Francis, United States Presidents Gerald Ford, Richard Nixon, and Barack Obama, French President François Hollande, King Juan Carlos I and Queen Sophia of Spain, Singapore

Parish Social Ministry

JOB DESCRIPTION: Coordinator of Parish Social Ministry

We need to build local communities of faith where our social teaching is central, not fringe; where social ministry is integral, not optional; where it is the work of every believer, not just the mission of a few committed people and committees.
—Communities of Salt and Light, U.S. Catholic Bishops, 1993

Vision of Ministry:

Rooted in the servant ministry of Jesus, the Director/Coordinator of *Parish Social Ministry* values and supports the inherent dignity and interdependence of all people. This position is an opportunity to assess and minister to the diverse needs of the most vulnerable of our brothers and sisters in our communities. The Director/Coordinator's primary responsibility is to build parish leadership and participation in the community by engaging people in various aspects of *Parish Social Ministry* through direct service, convening and advocacy using the principles of Catholic Social Teaching.

This position is much more a ministry than it is a job. The *Parish Social Ministry* Coordinator must be a person of faith, have a deep appreciation for the dignity of the human person, a compassion for those who are most vulnerable in our society, and a willingness to advocate with them to change both their circumstances and the structures or situations that cause them.

The *Parish Social Ministry* Director/Coordinator is an integral member of the parish staff with the responsibility of infusing the tenets of Catholic Social Teaching into all aspects of parish planning and life.

Responsibilities and Tasks:

To assess the needs of the parish community, create services and supports to address those particular needs and to engage the whole parish in implementing those services and supports. The work of PSM is not meant to be done by a select few. The coordinator should create many options for parish community members to participate in service as they're able.

To collaborate with the Pastor, under his supervision, and with members of the parish staff, integrating Parish Social Ministry with the overall mission of the parish.

To promote the presence and vision of *Parish Social Ministry* to the parish and the community at large.

To engage the parish community in understanding and acting on Catholic Social Teaching.

To work with appropriate ministers in the parish to provide opportunities to integrate *Parish Social Ministry* in the spiritual, liturgical and educational life of the parish.

To identify, invite, train and support teams of leaders and volunteer ministers to respond to the needs of the community and to participate in actions for justice.

To act as a responsible steward of contributions and expenditures related to *Parish Social Ministry*.

To participate in ongoing formation and education by participating in PSM Coordinator meetings, as well as trainings and convenings offered by Catholic Charities and other agencies.

To develop a cooperative partnership with Catholic Charities, other parishes, faith communities, schools, as well as community and civic organizations.

To collect data of persons served and services provided to report to the Pastor and parish.

I hope this gives everyone a bit of insight as to what Parish Social Ministry is all about. If you have questions or suggestions my door is always open.
