Dear Parishioners.

Jesus Christ is risen today! Alleluia! Alleluia!

I would like to greet everyone a Happy Easter! May this time truly be a rebirth for us all. May it bring us true comfort and security when things are not stable, unwavering hope confronted with darkness, and reconciliation and unity when we are in turmoil from hate and division.

As Christians, there are two dominant symbols that are most associated with Easter. First is the **Empty Tomb** and second the **Paschal Lamb**.

On the third day after his crucifixion, the women who had been followers went to his tomb and found it empty. They told the disciples, some of whom also went to the tomb and found it empty. And they left wondering what had happened to Jesus' body? Why is the empty tomb important? Its primary importance is that it points to the bodily resurrection of Jesus. That death could not hold him. And because Jesus has risen, we can look forward to our own resurrection as well. The empty tomb demonstrates that death is not the end of the journey. There is much more to come. This Sunday, as you return the nails that were given to you on Holy Friday, you profess the truth of the empty tomb: Death has no power over Christ!

The second powerful symbol of Easter is the Easter or Paschal lamb which symbolizes the Risen Lord, Jesus Christ. The Lamb of God is the Christian symbol of the Passover Sacrifice of Jesus' Death to Life. A picture can be found on page 5. As part of a yearly tradition, you may tear out the page and tape it by your front win-





Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Christ is risen! Alleluia!

Every Easter, you and I are reminded of the power of the Paschal Mystery. Commemorating the celebration of the first Eucharist at the Mass of the Lord's Supper, walking with Jesus on the road to Calvary on Good Friday in the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion, and celebrating Christ's triumphant conquering of sin and death in the Mass of the Resurrection on Easter is a potent reminder of God's love for us.

During this season of Easter and this time of National Eucharistic Revival, it becomes even clearer to us that the Paschal Mystery is not a mere historical event, but a mystery in which we are privileged to participate every time we celebrate the Mass. In the Easter sequence, we sing: "Christians, to the Paschal Victim, offer your thankful praises!" The word, *Eucharist*, which means, *thanksgiving*, implies that every time the Church gathers for the celebration of the Mass, she offers an act of "thankful praise" to the Lord. In this act of offering thanksgiving to God in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we as a priestly people offer the sacrifices of our lives with the offering of the Body and Blood of the Lord, by which our sacrifices take on new value and meaning (see, CCC, §1368).

Love is central to the mission of the Church. The sacrifices that we offer to God each day and in the celebration of the Eucharist are an expression of our love for him and for his people. When Christ appeared to Peter and the apostles on the Sea of Galilee after his Resurrection, he asked Peter: "Do you love me?" As he responds, "yes, Lord" to that three-fold questioning, Christ calls him to mission: "feed my lambs...tend my sheep...feed my sheep" (see John 21:15-19) Like Peter, you and I are faced with that same question from the Lord: "do you love me?" In other words, do we take the contemplative time that our hearts yearn for to renew our love for the Lord? In the offering of our time in prayer we are reminded of the very nature of God's love. Through that experience of true love, we realize that as disciples of Christ, you and I are called to mission: to bring the love of Christ to world; to glorify the Lord by our lives; to extend the Divine Mercy to those who suffer; to let the earth shake with the joy of the Resurrection!

Every human heart is created to love. As we grow deeper in our devotion to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus as a Diocese this June, we ask the Lord to strengthen our hearts to love as Jesus loves and for the zeal to proclaim to those we encounter that "God is Love" (1 John 4:8,16).

I wish you and your families a blessed Easter Season!


LITURGY CORNER

WHY HAS THE CANTOR BEGUN TO SING AN ANTIPHON BEFORE THE COMMUNION HYMN?

The antiphons in the Roman Missal and Graduale Romanum are the texts given to us by the Church for each particular liturgy, so there really are no other texts more ideal to sing than the antiphons! Yes, we should still sing a hymn that will unite our hearts to Christ and one another, but if we add the antiphons, we have the opportunity to pray these special scripture verses from the Missal. When the cantor chants the antiphons, we can begin to see the rhythm of the liturgical year in a new way. We can start to identify certain texts with

certain liturgies, which enriches our liturgies, as well as, our personal devotion to sacred scripture.
