Tuesday's feast celebrates Mary's Assumption into heaven. It is one of three feasts of Mary that are Holy Days of Obligation for Catholics in the United States. January 1 is the feast of Mary, the Mother of God, and December 8 is the feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary. The assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven has long been held as an important Catholic belief. The belief was not defined as dogma, however, until 1950 by Pope Pius XII. The dogma teaches that Mary, who was without sin, was taken, body and soul, into the glory of heaven.

The Gospel for this holy day recalls Mary's actions after the announcement of Jesus' birth by the Angel Gabriel. Mary goes to visit her cousin Elizabeth who is also with child. Elizabeth greets Mary with full recognition of the roles they and their unborn children will play in God's plan for salvation. Mary responds to Elizabeth's greet-

ing with her song of praise, the Magnificat. Both women recall and echo God's history of showing favor upon the people of Israel. Mary's Magnificat, in particular, echoes the song of praise offered by Hannah, the mother of Samuel.

The Gospel for this day reminds us that Mary's Assumption into heaven is best understood with regard for the full spectrum of Catholic beliefs about the person of Christ and the person of Mary. Only Mary, who was born without stain of original sin—the Immaculate Conception—could give birth to Christ, who is fully God and fully human. This is called the Immaculate Conception. Because of Mary's role in God's plan of salvation, she does not suffer from the effects of sin, which are death and decay. Mary is the first to receive the fullness of the redemption that her son has won for all of humanity. The Church, therefore, recognizes




Registration for 2023-2024



Baby to the Rescue

Studies of these microchimeric conversations are still in the early phases of analysis. However, mounting evidence shows a touching consideration on the part of these fetal cells. During pregnancy, some maternal illnesses will vanish because these fetal stem cells will rush to the scene of injury and mend the mother's damaged organ or heart.

Thus, the mother protects the baby from outside danger while the baby's stem cells detect internal hazards and rebuild the mother for safe delivery.

Natural Maternal Health Care

After birth, the baby's cells continue their work, which diminishes over time. Some researchers believe that fetal stem cells reduce the risk of breast and other cancers. The cells seem to fight against autoimmune disorders like rheumatoid arthritis. They have been found to help mothers with thyroid and liver damage by morphing into organ cells. The mother's heart might be the object of the cells' repair missions. The number of children does not seem to affect the regenerative power of the fetal cells. The important factor was the date of the last birth. The length of the pregnancy must be at least 20 weeks to have an effect. The regenerative power of the cells dwindles with time, and they reproduce less.



LITURGY NOTES

especially during Summer

Specific places require a specific permissible behavior and appearance. 
