

FROM THE PASTOR

The Transfiguration in Matthew's gospel occurs after Peter confesses his belief that Jesus is the Messiah and after Jesus predicts his Passion. In each of these Gospels, a discussion of the cost of discipleship precedes the Transfiguration.

In each Gospel, Jesus takes three of his disciples—Peter, James, and John—to a high mountain. While they are there, Elijah and Moses appear and converse with Jesus. Elijah and Moses are both significant figures in the history of Israel. Moses led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt and received from Yahweh the Ten Commandments. Moses represents the Law, which guides the lives of the Jewish people. Elijah is one of the most important prophets of Israel who helped the Israelites stay faithful to Yahweh, and some believed that Elijah's return would signal the coming of the Messiah for the Jewish people. The appearance of these two figures from Israel's history

indicated Jesus' continuity with the Law and the prophets. They also reveal that Jesus is the fulfillment of all that was promised to the people of Israel.

Upon witnessing Jesus' Transfiguration and seeing Jesus with Elijah and Moses, an awestruck Peter offered to construct three tents for them when a voice from Heaven affirms that Jesus is "my beloved Son" and commands the disciples to listen to him.

In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, Jesus instructed the disciples to keep secret what they had seen until after "the Son of Man has been raised from the dead." Until they witnessed Jesus' Passion and Death, the disciples could not possibly understand what he meant by being "raised from the dead." We, however, have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of the Transfiguration Gospel, we see an anticipation of Jesus' Resurrection, a foreshadowing of Christ's glory in Heaven, and the promise of our own resurrection.


Registration for 2023-2024



Respect Life

When the Baby Marvelously Repays the Mother for Her Sacrifice

The mother-child relationship is intimate and emotional. The mother gives everything to the baby that develops in her womb in an act of love. Such touching solicitude and sacrifice explain the universal appreciation of motherhood. It might also explain the antipathy of the left, which hates all links of dependency and sees pregnancy as a restriction upon a woman's freedom.

However, the bond is not only about sacrifice. As science explores the mystery of motherhood, researchers are making some marvelous discoveries. For example, the mother/child relationship is not a one-way giving of the mother. The link does not end at birth. There are times when the child marvelously repays the mother for her sacrifice.

Each discovery makes it ever more evident that the child is a separate and individual being, independent of the mother yet fabulously connected. Incredibly, this highly emotional and spiritual relationship is reflected in the biological workings of the bond.

The Baby and the Mother Exchange Cells

Indeed, the baby's cells are different from those of the mother from conception onward. However, since the mother is constantly nourishing and helping the baby's development, her cells find their way into the child's body.

Scientists now say that the baby's cells find their way into the mother's body and stay there. As much as 6 percent of the free-floating DNA in the pregnant mother can come from the baby, which diminishes over time.

The process of exchange and circulation of cells is called microchimerism. Thus, the child's physical presence in the



LITURGY NOTES

especially during Summer

Specific places require a specific permissible behavior and appearance. To give dignity to the presence of God in the Church as a designated sacred space and for the edification of our attending congregants, we respectfully ask that everyone (men, women, boys and girls) attend liturgical celebrations appearing modestly and respectfully dressed.


