In this week's Gospel, Jesus talks about what it means to be prepared to receive the Kingdom of Heaven. This week's reading follows a series of warnings and predictions by Jesus about the coming of the Son of Man. Jesus wants his disciples to understand that the exact day and time cannot be predicted. He teaches the disciples that they must remain vigilant so that they will not be caught unprepared.

When thinking about the parable of the wise and foolish virgins, it is important to consider the first-century wedding traditions of Palestine. Scholars tell us that it was the custom of the day for young maidens—friends and family members of the bride—to meet the bridegroom when he came to bring his bride to her new home.

As with many of Jesus' parables, several levels of interpretation are possible. In last week's Gospel, we heard Jesus warn against following the example of the Pharisees and scribes. If

read in the context of early Christianity's struggle to define itself against Pharisaic Judaism, this parable is a continuing critique of Judaism. It suggests that the Jewish leaders were like the foolish virgins, unprepared to meet Jesus, the bridegroom of Israel.

In the chapter preceding this parable, however, Jesus warns about the destruction of Jerusalem, the tribulation of the end times, and the coming of the Son of Man. When read in this context, today's parable is a warning to the Christian community to remain vigilant and prepared to receive Jesus, the Son of Man who will return at the end of time. This interpretation is supported by the reference to the delay of the bridegroom. The Christian community for whom Matthew wrote this Gospel was coming to terms with the realization that the promise of Jesus' return would not be fulfilled within their lifetimes. The question remains for us to ask ourselves, Are we ready to receive Jesus? Will we be prepared to receive him?



Also realize when we say 90 families that is a lot more than 90 people. We cannot thank you enough for reading the bulletin and donating what we need week after week. It is very heartwarming to know how much the community cares about the people who live here.

We would remind everyone to please not put perishable items in the food collection bins. They do not get emptied until Monday morning or Tuesday morning if there is a Federal Holiday on Monday. Also, we have gotten some bread and rolls donated. If you put bread and rolls in a bag and leave it next to the bin the bag(s) can be put on top of the rest of the donations. (otherwise they get squashed and become unusable). The past dated bread has been very moldy. If you purchase it past dated for the cheaper price if you freeze it and then make arrangements to bring it to social ministry we won't have to throw it out.

Thank you as always for thinking of the less fortunate. We can tell you that the people that come here are very appreciative of what the parish does for them.


WON'T YOU BE MY NEIGHBOR
