

Parish Social Ministry is humming along getting ready for Thanksgiving and Christmas. We have about 95 Families that will be getting Thanksgiving dinner fixings thanks to our Knights of Columbus Knights.

Long Island Cares has been very very good to us. Because of them and HPNAP we will be getting our new upright

freezer. (very soon we hope) Or else we do not know where the turkeys are going. We will find room don't worry.

With that being said, we have some people to thank. First and foremost, all the parishioners who donate to the pantry each and every week. With food prices the way they are it is very generous of you to donate week in and week out. Our volunteers who come week in and week out to distribute the food and all the other things they help with. We have had a couple of parishioners who have donated in a very big way, Dave Collotti who brought four pick up truckloads of food. Rosaria Luppy who does great things with Deer Park Youth. Whenever they do something they always share with us. Bob Corsentino has been bringing between 40 and 50 dozen eggs and 40 to 50 ½ gallons of milk every week and will continue from now until the end of the year. Stanley's bakery in East Islip has started donating bread, rolls and pastries on Friday evenings. It gets picked up and then on Saturday's we put it in freezer bags to be given to the clients during the week. 
WON'T YOU BE MY NEIGHBOR
