Dear Parishioners,

The liturgical Christmas season traditionally ends this weekend with the Feast of the Epiphany popularly known to many as the Feast of the Three Kings. The feast used to be celebrated on January 6th, the 12th day after Christmas. It was later moved to the first Sunday after January 1. The day commemorates the visit of the Three Magi from the East (traditionally referred to as Melchor, Gaspar and Balthazar) to the newly born Jesus in Bethlehem. They brought with them gifts of gold (signifying that Jesus is king), myrrh (signifying that he is savior) and frankincense (signifying that he was priest offering a fitting prayer to God).

Epiphany is a worldwide feast of the Catholic Church. One theologian described it as a festival principally solemnized in honor of the discovery of Jesus Christ made manifest to the Wise Men, who by a particular inspiration from God, came to pay homage and adore him.

There are many customs and traditions around the feast. In Italian folklore, La Befana, on old woman, brings gifts to children on the eve of the Epiphany in much the same way as Santa Claus does on Christmas Eve. In Mexico, people prepare mile long Rosca de Reyes (King's bread) with a baby Jesus figurine hidden in the bread; the one who gets the figurine is obliged to prepare tamales for everyone on the day of Candles on February 2. In Bavaria and Austria, children dress up as kings and hold up a giant star as they

go door to door to sing in exchange for money and candies. In France, the day is marked by sharing the round and flat Gelete des Rois or King's cake with children and adults. In Spain, children place their shoes on their front door and fill these with straw or hay for the three kings' horses to eat.

Regardless of how the day is celebrated, the Solemnity of the Epiphany reminds us of the simplicity and humility with which Jesus came into this world. It also shows that God could lead us to Jesus if we would allow Him to.

In one of his homilies on the Feast of the Epiphany, Pope Francis asserted how "our lives are a continuous search to encounter the light of Jesus." He urges that "we be cunning in our defense against darkness." He points out that "The destiny

of every person is symbolized in this journey of the Magi of the East."

FAMILY FAITH FORMATION AND RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY (Three Kings) - January 7, 2024

The **Wise Men** (**Three Kings**) from the Christmas Pageant return!!! This Sunday at the 9:30 am Mass, dressed in their kingly attire, they will be offering the gifts of bread and wine at the offertory.

CHALKING OF THE DOORS: On the Feast of the Epiphany, the family gathers to ask God's blessing on their home and on those who live in or visit the home. Marking the doorway to one's home is rooted in the Old Testament. Holy Scripture reminds us that God has at times commanded his people to mark their doors. The Israelites marked their doors with the lamb's blood on the night of the Passover (Exodus 12:7).

A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk to write above the home's entrance. It can also be written somewhere inside the home. **20 + C + M + B + 24**. The letters C, M, B have two meanings: They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: **Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar**. They also abbreviate the Latin words **Christus mansionem benedicat**, "**May Christ bless the house**." The "+" signs represent the cross and 2024 is the year. One may say the following prayer: "May the Lord watch over our going out and our coming in, from this time forth and forevermore. Amen."

"Chalking the door" is a way to celebrate and physically mark the occasion of the Epiphany and God's blessing of our lives and home. With time the chalk will fade. It is a reminder to let the meaning of the written symbols sink into the depths of our heart and be manifested in our words and actions.





Parish Social Ministry

We are in need of some big-ticket items. It never hurts to ask if anyone has the means to help.

We need another commercial refrigerator. Now that we have 128 families it is hard to turn down perishables because we do not have enough refrigerators to accommodate the donations. We are also in need of a commercial freezer.

We have had the opportunity to receive meats and frozen vegetables from Long Island Cares we could actually order more if we had more freezer space.

We just received 150 dozen eggs from Long Island Cares so now we do not have enough space for milk that is so needed.

We also have the opportunity to receive 25 to 50 cases of shelf stable food from Island Harvest, unfortunately we do not have enough wheeled stainless-steel shelves for them.

Any help is so appreciated.


WON'T YOU BE MY NEIGHBOR
