



FAMILY FAITH FORMATION AND RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Ash Wednesday is February 14 and is the beginning of the Season of Lent. We encourage our children to follow the 3 disciplines of Lent: PRAYER, FASTING and ALMSGIVING. We have lined up more intense prayer activities for our children throughout the season and are preparing for a Special Children's Station of the Cross (details coming soon). And for all Sundays of Lent, we encourage our children to participate in a Lenten practice of Giving Up (fasting) and Giving (almsgiving) in a campaign we call:

KIDShelping KIDS

Each week during Lent we are asking our children to bring an item to be donated to Parish Outreach. The kids already do this and yet we want families not just to bring random items but specific items that kids have for meals and snacks and share them with those in the community who have less or none. Each week we ask our children to bring a specific item(s) to make a difference to another child in need in our own neighborhood. We ask parents to take time to explain to them the value of giving up and sacrifice and also of becoming aware of those who are less fortunate and what they can do to help.

THE LEGEND OF THE LENTEN PRETZEL

A very long time ago, (in the early 600's) there was a man who worked for God. His job was being a MONK. A monk does everything in his life for God. He lives in a special place with other Monks, who pray and read the Bible many times during the day. They usually live in a building or group of buildings for this purpose. It is called a monastery. Monks usually make and/or grow their own food.

The monk in our story lived in a time when you could not eat meat or milk or eggs during Lent! So he and his brother monks had to figure out a special bread that did not use eggs or milk.

The monks were preparing a special Lenten bread of water, flour and salt – which is what pretzels are still made out of today.


Pretzels then began to be enjoyed by all people. They became a symbol of good luck and long life. They were also a common food given to the poor and hungry. They were cheap and easy to make and satisfied hunger.

This treat was given to the children as they learned their prayers. They began calling the treat "Pretiola", which means "little reward" in Latin. (a common language of the monks). Soon it was known the world over as a pretzel.

The simple shape of the pretzel, arms folded in prayer, reminds us to pray every day.




